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PREFACE

This impetus for this book goes back to Eibert Tigchelaar and a series of conversations during the summer of 2010 at the International SBL meeting in Tartu, Estonia, and the International Organization of Qumran Studies meeting in Helsinki. The recent publication of the reconstructed scroll of 1QH^a in DJD 40 was an important step forward in the study of this major collection of poetry from the Dead Sea Scrolls. Eibert noted that graduate students in particular, but also scholars who are not Qumran specialists, would benefit by having access to this text in a more accessible and much cheaper format than the full DJD volume.

Both of us readily agreed with this assessment and set about to see how such a volume could become a reality as expeditiously as possible. Although a number of different possibilities were proposed and considered, in the end we are very pleased that the Society of Biblical Literature took this on as an SBL-Brill co-publication. Given that the SBL Texts and Translation Series is now defunct, the volume was given a home in the Early Judaism and Its Literature series; perhaps other of the major texts from the Dead Sea Scrolls will eventually be included in a similar format in this series.

One of the main reasons for doing this volume is the confusion that continues to abound around the ordering and numbering of the columns and lines of the 1QH^a manuscript. Some people continue to use the “old” system, often labeled the “Sukenik” system. Various interim arrangements are to be found in translations and editions that were produced over the last two decades, most before the reconstructed scroll was fully accessible. Now there is the “new” or “reconstructed” or “Stegemann/Puech” system that was presented in DJD 40. In much secondary literature, it is often unclear which system of numbering for columns and lines is being followed. It is hoped that making the reconstruction of the 1QH^a manuscript more readily available will facilitate the adoption of the column and line numbers as presented in DJD 40.

The Hebrew text that is presented here as well as the English translation is basically taken from DJD 40. In the Hebrew transcription, the readings are those of Harmut Stegemann. In the English translation prepared by Carol Newsom, there are some minor revisions of what was in DJD 40, often for the sake of consistency and clarification. We are grateful to Oxford University Press for the requisite permissions for the OUP copyrighted materials.

Thanks are due to many people who helped to bring this project to fruition. A special debt is owed to Bob Buller, Editorial Director of the SBL, who prepared the manuscript for the press. Anne Whitaker Stewart, graduate student at Emory University, adapted the DJD Concordance to the Word List format with great care, accuracy, and attention to detail. Eric Montgomery, graduate student at McMaster University, did extensive proofreading and preparation of the charts in the introduction. Judith Newman as editor of the Early Judaism and Its Literature series and Rod Werline as her successor offered advice and accepted the volume into their series.

We hope that this edition of the Hodayot will serve graduate students and many other scholars who want to work with the Hebrew text. For specialized study, of course, one will still need to consult DJD 40 with its photographic plates, detailed analysis of the reconstruction, extensive notes, and a full concordance. But it is our hope that this study edition can make a contribution within its own limited parameters. May the availability of the text in this format encourage many more scholars in the years ahead to take up the study of this fascinating and challenging collection of religious poetry.

INTRODUCTION

THE HODAYOT MANUSCRIPTS

One of the scrolls that was found by the Bedouin in Cave 1 and purchased in November 1947 by Eleazar Sukenik for the Hebrew University was a collection of approximately thirty poems similar to the biblical psalms. Since the majority of them begin with the phrase “I thank you, Lord” (אודכה אדוני), Sukenik designated this “The Thanksgiving Scroll” (מגילת ההודיות), and the poems themselves came to be called “Hodayot” (in English, Thanksgiving Psalms or Thanksgiving Hymns). The photos and a transcription of this scroll, designated 1QH^a, were published in *The Dead Sea Scrolls of the Hebrew University*.¹ When archaeologists excavated Cave 1 in 1949, two fragments were found that contained text that overlaps with the large scroll. These fragments were all that remained of a scroll designated 1Q35/1QH^b, another copy of the same collection; they were published in 1955 by J. T. Milik in DJD 1. In Cave 4 six more very fragmentary manuscripts were found that contained text that overlaps with 1QH^a and, in a few places, fills in material missing from that manuscript (4Q427–432, 4QH^{a-e}, and 4QpapH^f). They were allotted to John Strugnell, who did extensive work on identifying and analyzing these very fragmentary scrolls; they were eventually published by Eileen Schuller in DJD 29 in 1999.

The fact that there are eight copies preserved and that 1QH^a was a large and elegantly crafted scroll indicates that these psalms had importance and authority for the community that wrote them and preserved them in the caves near the Dead Sea. They reflect the distinctive vocabulary and religious ideas that marked the type of Judaism found in other core works such as the Rule of the Community and the War Scroll, and at least some poems may have been composed by the Teacher of Righteousness, the founder of this sect. Although there are still many unanswered questions about the origin and use of these poems, they serve as an important resource for understanding the piety and religious devotion of those who composed them and those who continued to copy and recite them.

THE 1QH^a MANUSCRIPT

The 1QH^a manuscript is the largest, the most complete, and still the most important copy for working with this collection of poems; that is why this is the manuscript presented in this volume. There are some places where the 1QH^b and the 4QH^{a-f} copies can be used to fill in lacunae in 1QH^a, often only a few words but more extensively near the end of the scroll. When these copies are incorporated, columns 4–26 of 1QH^a are approximately three-quarters complete; unfortunately, very little remains from the first three and what were probably the last two columns. On the basis of the paleography, the scroll is dated to the early Herodian period, circa 30–1 B.C.E.

The “Sukenik Edition”

When 1QH^a came into Sukenik’s possession, he described it as “a badly damaged scroll” preserved in two separate parts, “three sheets, each one with four columns, or a total of twelve columns ... and a crumpled mass of about 70 detached fragments of various sizes” (Sukenik 1955). Sukenik recognized immediately that two scribes were involved in copying the manuscript: one scribe wrote up until column 11 line 22 (column 19 line 25 in the reconstructed scroll), then another scribe took over in the middle of the line and completed the scroll. (It has sometimes

been suggested that there was a third scribe who wrote a few lines at the point of transition, but this is far from certain.) As a result of this change of hand, it can be determined whether a detached fragment, even a very small one, came from the beginning or the end section of the scroll.

Although Sukenik had hoped to produce a full and complete study of the scroll, after his death in 1952 the committee appointed by Hebrew University determined that an edition should be published quickly, without any attempt to reconstruct the original order of the scroll. Sukenik designated the twelve columns on the three sheets as columns 1–12; he organized some of the larger fragments from the first scribe (scribe A) into columns that he numbered columns 13–17 and some fragments from the second scribe (often called scribe C) into column 18. Many of the smaller fragments could not be placed; he simply numbered them from one to sixty-six, according to their size and the scribal hand. Over the years, the impression was sometimes given that the numbering of the columns reflected the real order of how the original scroll looked, that is, that the scroll began with Sukenik's column 1. In fact, of course, it was obvious that columns 13–17 must have come from the beginning of the scroll (before columns 1–12), since they were written entirely by the first scribe. Some of the fragments written by the second scribe were quite large (especially frgs. 1–9), but there was no way of knowing how they related to each other and in what order they came, so little could be said about them without a context.

Much study of the scroll in the 1960s concentrated on a form-critical analysis and on the question of who might have authored some or all of these poems. Based on the work of a number of German scholars (Morawe 1961; Jeremias 1963; Kuhn 1966), the poems were divided into two groups. One group, clustered in Sukenik's columns 2–9 (now cols. 10–17 in the reconstructed scroll) was designated the "Teacher Hymns." They were distinguished by distinctive linguistic features and vocabulary; where the opening formula is preserved, it is consistently "I thank you, O Lord," although in one place (col. 13:22) an editor deleted this phrase and replaced it with the formula "Blessed are you." The "I" voice seems very personal and to be speaking of the experience of an individual who was chosen by God to receive special knowledge of divine mysteries, who suffered persecution and opposition, and who served as a medium of revelation for a community; this individual is usually identified with the Teacher of Righteousness, who seems to have been the founder and leading figure of this community. The second group of poems, the "Community Hymns," are a more nebulous category. They vary in length and contain much more wisdom vocabulary; only a few incipits are preserved with the "Blessed are you" formula, and sometimes there are also a series of blessings toward the end of a psalm (in 19:30–35 and probably at the end of col. 26). The "I" voice speaks less about personal experience and suffering and more about general declarations of the knowledge and salvation received, combined with confession of profound human weakness and sinfulness. Some scholars assume that these poems were authored by multiple members of the community, though other scholars (e.g., Émile Puech in *EDSS*) argue for the authorial unity of the whole collection.

The Reconstructed 1QH^a Scroll

Relatively little attention was paid to the Hodayot in the 1970s and 1980s, in part because the copies from Cave 4 had not yet been published. However, two scholars, Hartmut Stegemann and Émile Puech, worked on the 1QH^a scroll over many years in order to reconstruct its original arrangement. On the basis of the recurring shapes and the patterns of the damaged pieces and by a series of holes that decrease and increase in size as the scroll was rolled, they were able to establish the original order of the columns and to put many of the smaller pieces into place. Although Stegemann and Puech worked independently, they arrived at basically the same results; this, in itself, speaks to the accuracy of their reconstruction. Stegemann did much of his work for his 1963 dissertation, but he did not publish a full description of his method and results until 2000 ("The Material Reconstruction of 1QHodayot"); Puech published an article in 1988 ("Quelques aspect de la restauration") describing his reconstruction in broad outline and a few selected passages in 1993 (*La croyance des Esséniens*). A complete text of the reconstructed scroll was first published in DJD 40 in 2009 by Hartmut Stegeman with Eileen Schuller, along with a translation by Carol Newsom. It is this reconstruction of the scroll that is presented in this study edition. The columns and lines have been numbered according to their place in the reconstructed scroll; for many letters that Sukenik had not attempted to decipher, Stegemann introduced new readings based on a close examination of the original scroll itself and on some new photographs.

As reconstructed, the original scroll was made up of seven sheets with four columns in each for a total of twenty-eight columns. It was about four and a half meters in length. The three joined sheets that are the best preserved, Sukenik's columns 1–12, come from the middle of the reconstructed scroll, that is, columns 9–20. The placement of many of the smaller fragments written by scribe A, on the basis of their shapes, allow for the reconstruction of much of columns 4–8; there are a few larger fragments that must have come in columns 1–3, but it is very unclear exactly how they are to be placed. The preservation of overlapping text in 4QH^b and 4QH^c allows for the placement of some of the bigger fragments written by the second scribe and hence the reconstruction of much of columns 21–26; indeed, this produces some “new” psalms. There are a couple of fragments that must have been in column 27 or in columns 27 and 28; it is theoretically possible that there was still another sheet, but there is no positive evidence, and very few fragments from it would have remained. Of the sixty-six fragments, all but sixteen have been placed. In addition, six more very small fragments that Puech identified as being 1QH^a fragments (though they had not been published by Sukenik) have also been incorporated.

One of the most important results of the reconstruction is that the “shape” of the 1QH^a scroll is now clear. The Teacher Hymns (cols. 2–9 according to Sukenik, 10–17 in the reconstructed scroll) came in the middle of the scroll, with a collection of Community Hymns at the beginning (cols. 1–8) and another collection of Community Hymns at the end (cols. 18–28). The reconstruction, along with some evidence that can be incorporated from various 4Q copies, has clarified in many places where individual psalms begin and end, although there are still some places of uncertainty or where the evidence can be interpreted in different ways. There are between twenty-eight and thirty-four psalms in the collection (see appendix C and Stegemann 2003).

1QH^b

Only two fragments remain from this manuscript (1Q35), corresponding to 1QH^a 15:30–16:1 and 16:13–14. The second fragment has very narrow lines and only two lines of writing, followed by a section of leather that is ruled but not inscribed. It is not at all clear why the scribe did not continue writing or even whether this was ever a complete copy of the entire collection.

THE 4QHODAYOT MANUSCRIPTS

The six copies from Cave 4 are all fragmentary and badly damaged. Five are written on leather (4QH^{a–e}) and one on papyrus (4QpapH^f). Of the approximately 125 fragments in total, about forty preserve text that overlaps with passages in 1QH^a. In this study edition, the Cave 4 manuscripts with overlapping text have been incorporated into the 1QH^a manuscripts and marked by underline (regular underline, dotted underline, and broken underline are used to distinguish when there are different manuscripts overlapping in the same column). In some places, a Cave 4 copy can supply letters and words that were missing from the 1QH^a manuscript.

There is one psalm that is partially preserved in 4QH^a frg. 8 i 13–ii 19 that is not found in any of the preserved columns of 1QH^a (though it is possible that it was part of cols. 1–3 or cols. 27–28). A few other fragments of significant size in the 4Q copies have not yet been identified with any text in 1QH^a, and there are many tiny fragments with only a letter or partial letter so that it is impossible to say if they overlap or not. For all these fragments, it is necessary to consult the complete publication of the 4Q manuscripts in DJD 29.

4QH^a is a manuscript of about sixteen fragments, written in a semi-cursive hand from possibly as early as 75 B.C.E. The order of the psalms is different from that in 1QH^a, as is clear from one of the larger fragments (8), where the transition between three psalms is preserved. All of the psalms belong to the category of the Hymns of the Community and contain a large number of liturgical elements (the use of the plural, series of blessings, the calendar of the times); this may indicate something about the distinctive nature of this collection.

4QH^b is the earliest copy of the Hodayot, written in the first quarter of the first century B.C.E., circa 100–75 B.C.E. Some seventy-five fragments are preserved, though many are very tiny and cannot be identified. In the sections where transitions are preserved and in the latter part of the scroll where the shapes of the fragments give us some indication of how they were originally ordered, it seems as if this copy was identical with 1QH^a in the content and order of the psalms. Very little is preserved from the first part of the scroll, but it seems to have corresponded with

1QH^a (alternatively, Harkins 2010 proposes that this copy did not contain the first collection of Community Hymns corresponding to 1QH^a cols. 1–8).

4QH^c is a very small manuscript with narrow columns and only twelve lines per column; perhaps it was a copy for personal use. It could not have contained all the material found in 1QH^a, since that would have required a scroll of some fourteen or fifteen meters (and with its small height, such a scroll would have been impossible to roll). Four fragments remain from this scroll, and the sections that are preserved all overlap with columns 13–14 of 1QH^a. It is probable that this scroll contained only the Teacher Hymns.

4QH^d is a single fragment that overlaps with 1QH^a 12:15–19. It is impossible to say if this one fragment is all that survived from a complete Hodayot copy or whether this was originally a smaller collection.

4QH^e is preserved by two fragments, though the first fragment has sometimes been published separately as a distinct manuscript, 4Q471b. Both fragments overlap with the so-called “Self-Glorification Hymn” that is preserved most extensively in 4QH^a fragment 7, along with a few very small fragments from 1QH^a (from col. 26) and from 4QH^b. In this scroll, the Self-Glorification Hymn seems to come at the beginning, as indicated by the wide margin on the right of fragment 1.

4QpapH^f is a badly damaged papyrus scroll of which twenty-nine pieces survive. The identifiable fragments overlap with 1QH^a 9:13–16:10. It can be established on material grounds that the scroll began with the psalm of 1QH^a column 9, the so-called “Creation Hymn,” and continued with the Teacher Hymns.

In addition to filling in some of the lacunae in 1QH^a, the 4Q copies are important as we seek to understand how the collection(s) were put together. 4QH^a and 4QH^e clearly have a different order of psalms than that of 1QH^a. 4QH^c and 4QpapH^f seem to indicate that the Teacher Hymns or the Teacher Hymns plus the Creation Hymn functioned as blocs of material that circulated independently. However, much more study is required before all the evidence (including orthographic variations between copies and within 1QH^a in particular) can be compiled and analyzed and a comprehensive hypothesis of compositional development can be proposed.

APPENDIX A: CONVERTING COLUMNS/FRAGMENTS AND LINE NUMBERS FROM THE SUKENIK SYSTEM TO THE RECONSTRUCTED SCROLL

Citations of the Hodayot in books and articles written in past decades used the column/fragment number and line number from Sukenik’s edition (1954/1955). These can be converted to the column number and the line number of the reconstructed scroll according to the chart below.

“INTERIM EDITIONS”

Citations of the Hodayot in books and articles written from the 1990s on are sometimes complicated and confusing. Often the column numbering of the reconstructed scroll is used but the line numbers of Sukenik’s edition. This system is found in such “interim editions” of 1QH^a as *DSSSE* (García Martínez and Tigchelaar 1997); *DSSR* (Parry and Tov 2005); *The Complete Dead Sea Scrolls in English* (Vermes 1997); *The Dead Sea Scrolls, A New Translation* (Wise, Abegg, and Cook 1996); *Die Texte vom Toten Meer* (Maier 1995).

For the most part, these line numbers differ by one, two, or three lines from that in the reconstructed scroll. However, in columns 4–8 there is a larger disparity between the Sukenik line numbers and those of the Stegemann reconstruction. The chart below outlines how to make the conversion in these columns.

APPENDIX C: DIVIDING 1QH^a INTO INDIVIDUAL PSALMS

In some places the beginnings and ends of individual psalms are clear and undisputed, but in a number of places it is not obvious where one psalm ends and another begins, and different divisions can and have been proposed.

Sometimes a psalm division is indicated by spacing: either an extended *vacat* space at the end of a line or an indentation at the beginning of a line. In other cases an opening formula is fully or partially preserved. The formula **אודכה** (“I give you thanks”) always indicates the beginning of a psalm; sometimes (but not always) the **ברוך אתה** “Blessed are you” formula begins a new psalm. In some places there are headings similar to those found in the biblical Psalter, with the rubric **למשכיל** “For the *Maskil*” (in 5:12, 7:21, 20:7, 25:34; probably to be reconstructed in 1:1). In one place, 1QH^a 20:6, a scribal mark in the margin seems to indicate a new section.

The following chart gives a list of the individual psalms, according to readings and reconstructions proposed in DJD 40. There are a limited number of places where different divisions have been proposed, most often depending whether the “blessed are you” formula is taken as beginning a new psalm or just a subsection of a psalm. Some of these possibilities are noted in the chart.

For fuller discussion, see the section “Divisions of the Psalms” for each column in DJD 40. The divisions are those proposed by Hartmut Stegemann in his 2003 article “The Number of Psalms in *1QHodayot*^a and Some of Their Sections.”

4. [...] °m And as for me, I am speechless on account of their destructive[ness ...]°° °°°°q these. And they have reviled me
5. [... (my) ar]m is broken from its joint, and my foot has sunk into the mud. My eyes have sealed shut from seeing
6. evil and my ears from hearing of bloodshed. My mind was appalled by an evil plan. For Belial (is present) when their destructive intention manifests itself.
