PREFACE

The purpose of this book is to endeavour to show in a clear and simple manner the useful and practical truth that underlies the so-called occult study of reading character and disposition by the "period of birth", and the meaning of the number of each day and the influence of such things on human life. It will, I hope, be seen in reading these pages how perfect is the mechanism of the Universe, by which certain characteristics, and even details as to health, may be traced by a study of such things.

Many books have been published that pretend to deal with these questions, and although some of these books may be excellent in their own way, I have found that, as a rule, they have been too complicated in their method or too involved in their theories to be of practical use to the everyday man or woman who has not had the occult training necessary to understand complicated expositions on such subjects.

I have been encouraged to send this work on its way by the great success which has attended the publication of other works from my pen on the Study of the Hand, and the commendation I have received for the "faculty of expressing myself clearly, and in simple language", making the studies of practical use and help

to a wider range of people than books of this class usually reach.

In the present book I have drawn largely from my own experiences in this study of character, and I may safely state that there is not a rule I have given concerning character tendencies or health, which has not been thoroughly verified by me in my own work, which has extended in a professional way over a period of more than forty years.

Considering that during this period I was consulted on an average by from fifteen to twenty persons a day, I think I may safely claim to have had a wider field in which to gather the knowledge necessary for this book than, perhaps, any other writer on this subject.

I have seen so many wrecked and broken lives, where, had the people possessed even a slight knowledge of their own dispositions, they might have been saved, that I have felt it a duty to publish in a cheap and simple form the indications of character and tendencies which may be easily learned by a study of these "periods of birth", as set forth in the following pages.

I believe that any aid that may help towards the observation of character is not only useful but even essential if one wishes to keep abreast and succeed in this age of ever-increasing competition.

Those people who have some means at their command to learn their own characters and the dispositions of others must certainly be thrice armed in the battle of life, and consequently more successful than the people who know nothing of such things. Therefore I have no hesitation in saying that with this book in one's possession, one has a means towards winning success and also happiness.

With even a slight knowledge of what I designate in these pages as Life's Natural Affinities, the road to the divorce courts would not be so crowded as it is at present, parents would more easily understand their children and children their parents, and a great deal of suffering and friction might be avoided.

In conclusion, I trust I am not presuming too much when I venture to hope that this unpretentious volume may be the means of helping a large proportion of my fellow-beings to realise that in the study of the mysteries of life we are giving praise and glory to the Creator of Life, who in His infinite wisdom created all things to be used by man for the highest development of his kind.

THE ZODIAC

W

The Zodiac is the most important element in our study of Astrology and of the significance of the date of birth in a person's life and destiny. It is an imaginary circle around the Earth. This imaginary circle is the apparent passage of the

The word Zodiac is derived from the Greek word zôè meaning "life", and from diabos which means "wheel". Hence the word zodiac can be translated as the "wheel of life".

The word $z\hat{o}\hat{e}$ is etymologically linked to $z\hat{o}$ on, which means animal, and the Zodiac has often been called "The Path of the Animals". Eight of the twelve signs actually represent animals.

Sun, as seen from the Earth, as it traverses from 'day to night, sunrise to sunset', throughout the year. Actually this passage of the Sun is caused by the Earth's movement around the Sun.



The Ecliptic: The imaginary path of the
Sun around the Earth.

The apparent path which the Sun seems to take is circular in shape and is called ecliptic. All planets of the solar system also confine their lateral movement along this path or the track. This broad belt extending about 9° on either side of the ecliptic is known as the Zodiac.

The Zodiac, as explained, is circular in shape and therefore, has 360°. For astrological purposes, the ecliptic or Sun's annual path is divided into twelve equal parts. Each of the twelve equal parts contains 30°. These twelve equal parts are represented by imaginary figures or signs. These signs are not bodies but spaces of thirty degrees and divide the ecliptic, or the apparent track of the Sun (and planets) round the earth into twelve equal parts. These 12 divisions are called the 'Signs of the Zodiac'.

Thus we have 12 Zodiac signs one for each of the 12 parts. They are:

We now come to a very important part of our study, in which we shall consider the Sun's apparent passage through the twelve signs of the Zodiac, caused by the earth's movement around the Sun. On the basis of the 12 divisions of the Zodiac, the Greeks, as geometers and mathematicians, developed a calender during fifth century B.C. Each of the Zodiac signs was assigned to represent a set of days (dates) in a year. A person born between those dates is said to be born under that particular Zodiac sign.

Astrology attributes to each sign a certain specialised influence of its own. The nature of the influence is obtained from its ruler or its lord.

From the Sun's position each month we may judge of the character of each individual. We shall learn that, more or less, every person born during the period in which the Sun passes through a particular sign of the Zodiac will exhibit its characterisites as delineated in this study. This will indicate the character of the Individual then born, and by the same rule when the Moon is found in these signs at birth the Personality will be described.

The Cusp

Since the Zodiac is circular in shape, each sign is under the influence of its previous sign and the incoming sign for a period of seven days. These junction points of the houses are called the "cusp" of the houses. For example the Zodiacal sign of Capricorn commences on December 21, but for seven days, it is overlapped by the "cusp" of the previous sign—Sagittarius. It does not come into its full strength until or about December 28. From this date onwards it is in full strength until January

20, and is then for seven days gradually losing its strength on account of being overlapped by the "cusp" of the incoming sign — Aquarius.

So, each sign has two "cusp" periods during which its influence is diminished because of its preceding and succeeding signs.

The Elements

The twelve Zodiacal signs are also divided into four groups, representing the four basic elements—Fire, Earth, Air and Water. Each of the elements rules three signs. Thus the signs, starting from Arics onwards, are termed sequentially as Fiery, Earthy, Airy and Watery.

Each group of three signs is called 'Triplicity'. The practical significance of this division of the sign into elements will fully be understood later in this book.

Generally people born under Fire signs are enthusiastic, energetic and optimistic. People of Earth signs are practical, down to earth and realistic. People born under Air signs are intellectuals and thinkers, whereas people of Water signs are of emotional nature. They are also sensitive and intuitive.

JANUARY

he Zodiacal Sign of C a pricorn commences on December 21, but for seven days, being overlapped by the "cusp" of the previous sign — Sagittarius, it does not come into its full power until on or



about December 28. From this date onwards it is in full strength until January 20, and is then for seven days gradually losing its strength on account of becoming overlapped by the "cusp" of the incoming sign — Aquarius.

People born between January 20 and 27, partake of the characteristics of both Capricorn and Aquarius, and the same rule applies to all those born within the "cusp" of any sign.

Personality Traits

People born in this period have a deep devotional nature, and make great efforts to do good to others, but generally to masses of people rather than to individual. Although they appear cold, they have warm hearts

towards suffering, and as a rule they give largely to charities.

If inclined to be religious they usually go to extremes, and become fanatical in their zeal. They worship intellectual, clever people, and are deep thinkers.

They are quick in their intuition of people and things but they are as a rule, too easily discouraged and lack self-confidence. They rarely interfere with the affairs of others, but they will never stand interference from others too.

They generally make their greatest mistake by espousing an unpopular cause, the "under dog" in the fight, and so often make the bitterest enemies by their actions being misunderstood.

Such people generally feel their responsibilities too keenly, and often worry themselves into bad health.

On Being Successful

These people are independent and high-minded in all their actions and detest being under the restraint of others.

They often make excellent speakers, but not so much through oratory as by "plain speaking;" they "hit straight from the shoulder," and go direct to the point of the subject in plain language. Infact they are thinkers, reasoners and make natural heads of business organisations or any form of government work. They must be leaders in whatever they are engaged, or else they are inclined to lose their interest in their work. They should aim for some form of public life, and in such careers they generally do best such as in the

government and in responsible positions of control and management of others.

Friends and Relationships

People born in this period usually make the most solid and best friendships with people who are born in their own period viz., between December 21 to end of January, from April 20 to the end of May, and with their "central affinities," June 21 to July 20-27, and August 21 to September 20-27 (See Fig. VII, Page 113).

These people have strong mental force, but they are, as a rule, generally misunderstood by others. They have strange ideas of love, duty and social position, and for this reason they are often considered "odd," and do not fit in easily with their neighbours. They are inclined to excite bitter opposition but bear up against it with a philosophic spirit. Their home and family life is very often a troubled one. They usually have distressed or invalid relatives to look after and as a rule they sacrifice themselves to home interests. They feel "lonely hearted" and misunderstood.

Health

The influence of Saturn on those born in January indicates a vigorous constitution and good physical stamina. At the same time there is a strong tendency to depression and despondency which if not acted against will induce bilous attacks, trouble with the gall bladder, ulcers in the stomach, deragements of digestive organs and stoppages of the intestines. As a rule these people are more inclined to suffer from rheumatism and gout, pains in the feet, and hurts and accidents to the legs and ankles, troubles with the spleen and lever, ruptures, decay of the teeth, and pains in the teeth and cars.

Cold seriously affects these persons. They are likely to suffer from asthma, bronchial catarrh and such like ailments. High dry climates suit them better than living in low altitudes. They need to study well their diet and keep up the circulation by adequate exercise, also avoid draughts, damp and cold winds. All kinds of skin diseases do happen to them. This part of Zodiac has a kind of sub-rule over the stomach, they often suffer from vomiting and nausea. If their outlook should ever become limited or cramped, and conditions show signs of giving way, their innate gloom may turn to hypochondria unless they exert every force of their nature to cultivate the spirit of cheerfulness.

Finance

The dominant influence of Saturn ruling the birthmonth is not a favourable significator for those born in January, as it causes delays, hindrances and limitations in regard to financial advancement, at least in the early part of the life.

Advancement, gain and success in money is promished by industry, perseverance and by carefulness, thrift and economy. Infact, these people acquire wealth through their own personal efforts than by any dint of good fortune. Advantageous investments for them would be in land or house property, the building up of factories dealing especially in coal, lead or iron products, machinery for transport work or agriculture, the developing of farming enterprises and all things solid and concrete.

They should never lend money without security, or they would be sure to lose. Investment of money

should be entirely based on the solid foundations of the concerns.

Colours

The colours which give the most suitable vibrations to persons born in this period, and which are the most beneficial to them, are all tones of grey, all ranges of violet, purple and black.

Stones

The birth stones for this period are moon-stones, pearls and amethysts.

date onwards it is in full strength until February 19. It is then for seven days gradually losing its strength on account of becoming overlapped by the "cusp" of the incoming sign — Pisces.

Those born in the "cusp" take from the qualities of both signs.

Personality Traits

People born in this period are generally oversensitive. They feel very lonely in life and are easily wounded in their feelings. They are usually high-strung, and their nerves are generally over-wrought; they often lose control of themselves, and say or do things that they bitterly regret later. They read character instinctively, and for this reason they "see through" people too easily to be really happy. They are generally very active for the public good, and will often give all they have to relieve the distress of others. They take a great interest in public meetings, gatherings of people and public ceremonics. They love theatres and concerts, and like to be where crowds of people congregate, and yet they always have the feelings that they are alone in life.

On Being Successful

People born in this part of the year are generally good reasoners, and are very successful in debate and argument, and difficult to convince. They genrally have a scientific turn of mind especially in relation to inventions dealing with electricity or such like things.

They are excellent in business and finance when they apply their minds to such things, but as a general rule they are more successful for others, and make more money for others than for themselves.

They require some call of duty or circumstance to show the qualities that are in them. If "the call" does come they often rise to great things, but if it does not come, they wait often until it is too late to develop their great qualities.

If people born under this sign overcome their sensitiveness and develop their will-power, there is no position in life they could not attain. They generally succeed best in some large sphere of action, where they can feel their responsibilities for others. Those who are "awakened" usually leave a great name behind. They have "visions" and imagination.

They generally possess the controlling powers in their eyes which subdue others.

Their greatest fault is that it generally takes some sudden call of circumstances to "make the most of themselves."

If born with money, these people rarely show what is in them. They are inclined in ordinary conditions to let their opportunities slip, or realise them only when it is too late. If, however, people born in this period belong to the lower order of humanity, they lose all sense of honour and principle, and are extremely unreliable, tricky in money matters, dishonest, and unscrupulous in gaining what they desire.

Friends and Realtionships

In real friendship or love people born in this period get on very well with those born from May 21 to June 20-27 and from September 21 to October 20-27 and also with those born in November 20-27, or with those born in the centre of the triangle. (See Fig. VI, Page 112).

They are not demonstrative in affection, but feel very deeply. If they "like" they fight to the bitter end for their friend; but if they dislike they are just as intense, and if they belong to the lower plane of humanity they will stick at nothing to avenge an injury or what they feel to be an injustice.

Health

These people are inclined to suffer most from the stomach, often through the nerves of the stomach in some peculiar manner that is difficult to relieve with ordinary medicine. If care is not taken they are inclined to suffer from the bladder, kidneys and swellings or dropsy in the legs.

Bad circulation of the blood and cold hands and feet also generally trouble them. Attacks of jaundice are inclined to affect them.

They are also prone to suffer from accidents to their teeth, pains in the knees and middle of the spine, and breaks or sprains of the feet and ankles, and often some delicacy of the eyes.

Finance

The influence of Saturn and Uranus governing this part of the Zodiac gives the likelihood of great and sudden changes in the fortunes. People born in this month are liable to experience remarkable and unexpected reversals and they should be very careful in matters of an uncertain or hazardous nature. It is a favourable position however, for them receiving an income from trusts, insurance companies, banking concerns, railway companies, electrical installations, aviation and through floating of inventions.

Unless they are extremely prudent, their income, however, will always be more or less uncertain. At some period of their lives, they are likely to come into a great deal of money from a totally unlooked for source.

Colours

The most favourable colours for them are all shades of what are known as "electric shades," as electric blues and electric greys. These are the foundation colours for people born during this period.

Stones

The birth stones for this period are sapphires, pink topazes, and moonstones.

February 27. From this date onwards it is in full strength until March 20, and it is then for seven days gradually losing its strength on account of becoming overlapped by the "cusp" of the incoming sign — Aries.

Personality Traits

Although by nature generous, people born in this period are usually over-anxious about money matters, and inclined to worry about what their future position in life may be. This state of mind is, I think, largely due to their dislike and dread of being dependent on others more than from any love of money.

This quality makes them, however, much misunderstood, and they are often considered close in money matters when in reality they are not.

People born in this period often go back on thier promises, especially on questions of money. They promise to give, on the impulse of the moment, but if they have time for reflection then the fear of future poverty forces them, as a rule, to break their promise or give, perhaps, only one half of what they had stipulated.

They are inclined to brood and to melancholy, or to imagine all the world is against them and that they are being made martyrs of.

The strongest and weakest characters are found in this sign. Some are inclined to gratify their innate sense of luxury and self-indulgence and, if this side of the nature is the one that controls, they are likely to be too easy going, to be too receptive to their surroundings, to become influenced by false friends, to give way to fraudulent schemes and in some cases are inclined to become addicted to drugs or drink.

If, however, persons born in this part of the year find some purpose worth living for, they rise to the emergency as no others can. These are the people that one meets sometimes in life who surprise their friends by their sudden change of character.

They can, in a moment, throw off any form of weakness or self-indulgence, and rise to any height of self-denial. All persons born in this part of the year have a dual element as the mainspring of their nature. It simply depends on which of the two roads they have decided to follow.

People born in this period are highly emotional. If they belong to the weak side of it, they are easily influenced by the people with whom they are thrown

into contact, but if they belong to the stronger side, their emotional nature can lift them up to any height.

They are generally fond of the sea and large expanses of water. If circumstances do not permit them to travel, they will, if they possibly can, make their homes where they can see the ocean, or on the side of some lake, or river.

Almost all have a curiously mystical side to their nature as well as the practical. They are often classed as superstitious, the occult in all its forms appealing to them in one way or another.

They love to search out or investigate the unknown, the philosophical, or the mysterious. Although by nature generous, they have at heart a curious dread of poverty, and for that reason do not allow their generous instincts to get the better of them, unless they are under the influence of someone they love. In such a case they become easily influenced and are as likely as not to give away all they possess.

They require some call of duty or circumstances to show the qualities that are in them. If "the call" does come, they often rise to great things, but if it does not come, they wait often until it is too late to develop their great qualities.

On Being Successful

These people possess a curiously "natural understanding," which they do not obtain from books or study. They easily acquire, or rather absorb knowledge, especially of the history of countries, travel, research, and like subjects.

These people are also more mentally ambitious than otherwise. They may know their subject well in

their mind, but they will hesitate and undervalue their own individuality if they find they have to put it to a test in any public manner.

They have great fidelity and loyalty if trust is imposed on them, and great persistence in carrying out whatever work they have in their hands to perform, and they are generally found in positions of trust and responsibility for others.

Many artists, musicians and literary people are born in this period, but they must receive great encouragement ever to make the best of themselves.

They have great loyalty to friends or to any cause they take up, provided they feel they are trusted or looked up to. They are generally successful in all positions of responsibility, but at the same time they are not inclined to push themselves forward, and usually "wait to be asked" before giving their opinions.

They are great respectors of "law and order," and uphold the conventions of whatever the social order in which they may be found.

In business they are good in dealing with shipping, trade with foreign countries, or sea-borne commerce of any description.

Sea captains, sailors of all kinds, also travellers are often found under this sign.

Money has no value in their eyes. It is simply something to be used and nothing more.

Friends and Relationships

Personality Traits

NOVEMBER

date onwards it is in full strength until November 20 and is then for seven days gradually losing its strength on account of becoming overlapped by the "cusp" of the incoming sign — Sagittarius.

Personality Traits

People born in this section of the year seem to be a mass of contradictions. The best and the worst seem to make this period their chosen battlefield.

Upto nearly twenty years of age they are usually extremely pure-minded, virtuous, and religious, but once their nature is roused they are often found to swing in the opposite direction.

Personality Traits

Those born in this section of the year are executive, fearless, and determined in all they undertake.

They are apt to be too decisive and too outspoken in their speech, and so are often misjudged in their criticism, and make bitter enemies.

They are generally very honourable, but chiefly when they feel others are placing implicit confidence in them. Brutally truthful, they resent deception, and unmask any attempt to deceive others even when such

They are great church-goers, even from the standpoint that their example may be beneficial to the world around them.

They venerate law and order, make the best of mothers, and train their children on the strictest lines of obedience, punctuality and upright living.

On Being Successful

They concentrate all their attention on whatever they are doing at the moment, and seem to see no other way but theirs until their effort is made.

Their minds are so intensely quick that they will often be found breaking in on the conversation of others with what they think is the end of the story or the solution of the question.

They are, however, the great workers of the earth; they never seem to tire until they wear themselves out, or drop with fatigue.

They have great enterprise in business, but never feel themselves confined to any one line. For this reason one often finds the men of this period change from clergymen to stockbrokers, or from professors to followers of trade; while the women successful in one line of work will just as quickly throw themselves heart and soul into some entirely new study.

As a rule, perhaps from their intense concentration and will power, they are successful in whatever they do, and they should always be allowed a free hand in choosing their vocation.

People of this second class are eaten up with selfish ambition. In any country in which they live they force their way into government positions. They toady to titles, and are snobs beyound description. They are also hypocrites and religious bigots of the worst class, but the simplest student of humanity after a little observation, will never confound them with those of the other class in the same Sign.

Nearly all classes in this Sign are devoted to music, even if it is only in appreciation. They often make

extremely brilliant musicians, and even when this art has not been developed they will still be largely found as markers of musical instruments or as the greatest patrons of music. They will pay for church organs, boxes at the opera, and charity concerts with as much zest as children buy bonbons.

They are, however, inclined to go to extremes in all things, and make sudden decisions, or change their minds rapidly, for which they may have regrets, but they are too proud to acknowledge their error.

People born in this period, even when successful, should never cease to be actively employed-inactivity for them would mean despondency and an early decay.

Friends and Relationships

Their most lasting unions and friendships would be made with people born from March 21 to April 19-26, and July 21 to August 20-27, or in their own period, and they will also find excellent companions in those born in the centre of their triangle—namely, from May 21 to June 20-27. (See Fig. IV, Page 109).

People born in this part of the year generally enjoy great popularity; they often become "Public idols" and have fame and position thrust upon them. They are inclined to be decisive and outspoken in their words and in consequence often make bitter and unforgiving enemies.

The men of this Sign nearly always marry on impulse and regret it ever afterwards, but they are too proud to show their regrets and too conventional to appeal to the courts of assistance so they often pass for models of married happiness even when they are the most wretched.

The women of this Sign are, as a rule, the nobler of the two sexes; they do all they can to make their husbands or their children successful and are willing to sacrifice themselves to that end. They are generally chaste and pure in their marriage vows and have an intense love of home and even when unhappily married they try to make the best of a bad bargain.

Health

The influence of Jupiter on the lives of people born in this period of the year, promises that the only dangers which threaten their health arise from overactivity of mind and body. They are also rather careless in the matter of exposure to cold and heat and thus likely to suffer from acute bronchitis. They will be also inclined to suffer from rheumatism, skin troubles, delicacy of the throat and lungs. In their latter years, they may suffer from nervous system, sciatica and paralysis. They could escape from such things by a study of temperance in their mode of living. They should keep the blood pure, avoid drugs and live hygienically. They also need to give their mind more rest and practise the art of relaxation as much as possible.

Finance

People born in this period of the Zodiac have the greatest chance of making money from the work of their brains. They have much originality of ideas and should follow their own intentions in everything they do. They seldom do so well with partners and associates, but are much loved by employees, servants and those under their authority.

They often gain through legacies and gifts but as a general rule they do not accumulate much wealth.

If they do so, it is usually depleted in their advanced years.

Colours

Their most suitable colours are all shades of violet and mauve and violet-purple.

Stones

Their most favourable stones are amethysts and sapphires.

Important To Readers

It has been established by scientific observation that there are only Nine Planets in our Earth's Solar System that relate to life in this world. It has also been demonstrated by scientists that an exactly similar Solar System is repeated in the molecules revolving round all atoms in nature.

In the same way there are only Nine Numbers by which all calculations on this earth are made. Beyond the numbers of 1 to 9 the rest are repetitions, a 10 being simply a 1 (1+0=1) an 11 is 1 plus 1, a 2; a 12 is 1 plus 2, a 3, and so on. Every number no matter how large, can be reduced to a single figure by what is called "natural addition" adding from left to right. The final single digit that remains is called the 'spirit or soul number' of the previous numbers added together.

It therefore follows that all Birthdates come into the 1-9 scale and respond to the numbers given to the Nine Planets of our Solar System. The number of a person born on 28th will be (2+8=10 and again 1+0=1) one. Similarly the number of a person born on 17 will be (1+7=8) eight. A person born on the 10th, 19th or 28th of a month is as equally a "Number One" individual, as if they had been born on the single 1.

Relationships Based on Occult Significance of Numbers and Birth Dates

t first sight it may seem extravagant to say that people may easily and quickly learn whether or not they will be in sympathetic harmony with those they meet by applying the following few simple rules which I have found, by long experience, cover one of the mysterious sides of occultism in regard to Numbers.

Even a few tests will prove to those who care to try that there is a great deal in the curious theory which I am about to lay before the readers of this book.

When dealing with such subjects I endeavour to write in such a clear and simple way that even those who have had no experience whatever in occult studies may be able to understand and act on my remarks, and make experiments for themselves.

Only Nine Numbers

In our solar system, there are only nine planets and it is necessary to grasp the idea that there are really only nine Numbers, by which all our calculations are made. They are the foundation numbers of all sciences, and all calculations lie between the Number 1 and the number 9. All others are only a repetition of these numbers. For example, a number 10 is a 1 with 0 added, and 11 is when added together a 2; a 12 is a 3; a 13 is a 4; and so on up to any number that one may examine.

We may illustrate this as given below:

The occult meaning of each of these nine numbers, as they occur in the Birth dates of men and women, determine the secrets of human nature.

These numbers were given to the nine planets that control our solar system. The day of birth as key number is related to the planet bearing the same number.

Relationship between Numbers and Planets

- 1. The number 1 stands in symbolism for the Sun.
- 2. The number 2 stands in symbolism for the *Moon*
- 3. The number 3 stands in symbolism for the Planet *Jupiter*.
- 4. The number 4 stands in symbolism for the planet *Uranus*. It is considered related to the *Sun*.
- 5. The number 5 stands in symbolism for the planet *Mercury*.
- 6. The number 6 stands in symbolism for the planet *Venus*.
- 7. The number 7 stands in symbolism for the planet *Neptune*. The Planet Neptune has been considered as associated with the *Moon*.
- 8. The number 8 stands in symbolism for the planet *Saturn*.
- 9. The number 9 stands in symbolism for the planet *Mars*.

Birth Dates

Taking the above-explanation as a starting basis, the reader may now be able to follow my theory—a theory, by the way, that has taken me years to work out and prove, which is that independent of what part of the year one may be born in, a curious sympathy and attraction will be found to exist between all those who have the same number for their birth date. For example a person born, say, on the Ist of any month will find others that are born on the Ist, 10th (1+0=1), 19th (1+9=10; 1+0=1), or 28th (2+8=10, 1+0=1) of any month more sympathetic than people not born on these dates.

The next rule is that the double numbers 1 and 4 of the Sun and of the Moon numbers 2 and 7 are sympathetic to one another, as they are also to their own series, when taken as single numbers. For example, a person born on the 2nd is sympathetic to those born on the 7th, 11th (1+1=2), 16th (1+6=7), 20th (2+0=2), 25th (2+5=7), and 29th (2+9=11, 1+1=2)), which make all twos and sevens.

These persons would be sympathetic also to people born under what is called the sun's numbers 1 and 4, namely Ist, 4th, 10th (1+0=1), 13th (1+3=4), 19th (1+9=10, 1+0=1), 22nd (2+2=4), 28th (2+8=10, 1+0=1) and 31st (3+1=4) which make ones and fours.

People born under the Sun's numbers 1 and 4 and the Moon's numbers 2 and 7 are always attracted and "natural friends" to one another but all other numbers attract their own class.

Affinities in Human Beings

Such attraction is, however, more mental than physical. It is, as it were, that the planets of the same numbers rule the mind and make those born on the same dates have a similarity and sympathy of thought to one another.

Physical attraction takes place if the birth date of two people should be in certain months of the year, and if in such a case the numbers should also be found to be in sympathy then we would have both mental and physical attraction, which would make a union of friendship unbreakable. This is an illustration of that often misused expression that "marriages are made in heaven."

Such marriages are, in fact, made in the heavens by the planet and places of the year creating affinities in human beings, which has been so eloquently expressed in the following well-known verse:

"Two shall he born the whole wide world apart And speak in different tongues, and take no thought Each of the other's being, and no heed. And these o'er unknown seas to unknown lands Shall cross, escaping wreck, defying death, And all unconsciously shape every act, And hend each wandering step unto this end That one day out of darkness they shall meet And read life's meaning in each other's eyes."

In the following chapter I shall deal with this curiously interesting subject, and also show the affinities of those born in certain months with others.



Relationships Based on Life's Triangles and Affinities

The reader knows by now the path along which the sun moves is called the ecliptic. In reality, it is the pathway of the earth around the sun. The reader has also learnt that the broad belt extending to about 9° on either side of the ecliptic is known as the Zodiac. For astrological purposes the Zodiac is divided into 12 equal parts called Signs. These Signs are divided into four groups, representing the four basic elements — Fire, Water, Air and Earth. In turn each of the elements rules three signs:

Fire - Aries, Leo, Sagittarius

Water - Cancer, Scorpio, Pisces

Air – Libra, Aquarius, Gemini

Earth - Capricorn, Taurus, Virgo

These four basic elements are represented by four triangles — Triangle of Fire, Triangle of Water, Triangle of Air and Triangle of Earth.

These triangles fit together and represent the most perfect symbolism of the four elements necessary to human life — Fire, Water, Air and Earth.

In order to fix these four triangles clearly in one's mind, I would advise my readers to first draw an equilateral triangle (a triangle with all sides and angles equal) and place at its three corners or vertices the





Fig. III The Life's Triangles

sections of the year representing the three Zodiac Signs. Thus there will be four triangles representing the four elements (Fire, Water, Air and Earth) which in turn will rule the twelve Zodiac Signs.

Triangle of Fire

Taking the Triangle of Fire, place Aries (March 21 to April 19) at the top vertex, Leo (July 21 to Aug 20) at the left vertex and Sagittarius (Nov 21 to Dec 20) at the right vertex of the triangle. You will then have what are called the "Fire Affinities" in their proper places. By affinity I mean a natural or spontaneous attraction and sympathy between persons born under these Zodiac Signs. Such attractions, however, are more mental than physcial.

Since the lines of the triangle are of equal length, if you draw a line from any one vertex to its opposite side, it will divide the side in two equal parts. The centre will be at equal distance from the vertices on either side of the line so divided. The central point on the line is known as "Central Affinity".

Now draw a straight line from top vertex, Aries, to the side opposite. This line will divide the opposite side into two equal parts, and the point at which it cuts the side is the "Central affinity". On this central affinity point place Libra (Sept 21 to Oct 20). Thus Aries and Libra are in central affinity with each other indicating that these are equally strong but totally opposite in character.

Similarly if you draw a line from the Leo vertex which divides the opposite side into two equal halves, the point where it cuts is central affinity. On this place Aquarius (Jan 21 to Feb 18) which would indicate Leo and Aquarius in central affinity with each other–equally strong but opposite in character. If you look at the illustration you will see points of central affinity in the Fire Triplicity. Similar will be the case with Sagittarius and Gemini which are in central affinity with each other.

Triangle of Water

The symbolic triangle representing the element of water is formed in the following manner. Place Cancer (June 21 to July 20) at the top vertex, Scorpio (Oct 21 to Nov 20) at the left vertex and Pisces (Feb 19 to March 20) at the right. They are called "Water Affinities" in their proper places. You again draw a line from each vertex to the opposite sides, as indicated in the illustration and thus formed are their "Central Affinities".




Fig. V The Water Triplicity




Fig. VI The Air Triplicity



The symbolic triangle of the element of Air is formed in the following manner: Place at the top vertex Gemini (May 21 to June 20), at the left vertex Libra (Sept 21 to Oct 20) and at the right Aquarius (Jan 21 to Feb 18). These are called "Air Affinities" in their proper places. Draw lines from each vertex to their opposite sides and workout their "Central Affinities".

Triangle of Earth

The symbolic triangle of the element of Earth is formed in the following manner: Place at the top vertex Taurus (April 20 to May 20), at the left vertex Virgo (Aug 21 to Sept 20) and at the right vertex Capricorn (Dec 21 to Jan 20). You will then have what are called "The Earth Affinities" in their proper places. Again draw lines from eachy vertex to the opposite sides as before, and work out their "Central Affinities".

When these four triangles are constructed, the entire year is represented and people born in the sections symbolised by the different triangles will be attracted as affinities to one another, especially if their number should also be found to harmonise.

People born, however, in such triangles as are symbolised by Air and Water are favourable to one another, although one could not call them affinities. It is the same with the Air and Earth triangles, and with the Air and Fire, but in all such cases the Air people will dominate the others more by their mental than by their physical attraction.

The Earth and Water people can also blend, and make, as it were, solid material things together; but the mixture will be more that of the material than of the spiritual.

Fire and Earth people can also get on together, for in this symbolism the Fire will warm the Earth and make it fruitful.

Not True Affinities

All these cases cited may, as I say, get on together, and even be helpful to one another; but still these are not what one can call true affinities, and, such being the case, they are always liable to seperate, whereas those born in the same triangles, and especially when having the sympathetic numbers, when once they come together can never part, or if they do (under some unusual stress of circumstances) they generally come together again in spite of every influence that may try to keep them asunder.

People under the symbolism of Fire and Water will, however, never blend, and if forced to live together by necessity or marriage they will just as certainly seperate, and are likely in the end to become enemies.



CONCLUSION

I t naturally follows that if a person should make a special study of any one subject, from long experience, cultivation and studious research, he will in the end unravel, at least to some extent, the so-called mysteries of the subject on which he has so concentrated his attention.

To a student of Art, Art reveals her mysteries of colour, form, design, pose, and a thousand and one subtleties that escape the ordinary observer. To a student of Biology every leaf tells its own story, every tree its age, every flower its own pedigree.

To a student of Science, what is magic to the uninitiated becomes a natural phenomenon with general laws, governed by rules or calculations that all who choose can learn and understand.

In presenting this book to the public I need then offer no other apology for so doing, than that of having been a student of this particular branch of thought for a very long period, and having proved so-called theories by countless experiments and experiences. I feel I am at last in a position to give to the world at large the result of such studies.

It is admitted by all that the occult side of things has been the one side of life the least explored or investigated. That there is an occult or hidden part in actual relation to human life is on every side a conceded fact, but before this mystery — the greatest of all — the majority of thinkers have held themselves aloof.

In our age the physical and mechanical sciences have called for the greatest attention, yet such things as wireless communication and radium, today household words, have been stumbled across by so-called chance.

Already wireless communication has saved hundreds of lives, radium has done likewise, the mysteries of yesterday have become the commonplaces of today, and so knowledge in the eternal fitness of things becomes the servant of those who serve.

In pursuit of the laws which have controlled thought in recent centuries, man has, in earning his success on the physical and mechanical plane, forgotten the loss he has sustained from the lack of study and observation on the occult or psychic side of humanity. He is more occupied today in building implements for the destruction of life than he is in the problems of life itself, or in the finding out of those laws which create, control, and sustain life.

When Newton discovered gravitation, it was not supposed for a moment that he had solved the problem of the spheres, and it is sometimes forgotten that when he came to realise that beyond our system of stars, sun, moon and planets there were again the "fixed stars" with their countless systems, in the magnitude of the problem, he could only decide that there was again some occult law behind all, greater than any known law that could even be imagined.

I trust my readers who have followed my theories through this book have grasped the fundamental fact underlying these pages, that the knowledge I have endeavoured to give to the public is of *a practical nature* with the decided object of helping my fellow men to make the best of themselves and render their lives as successful as possible.

Up to now occultism has been associated with the idea that its students must belong to the domain of dreamers of dreams, or those who live in some world of their own. In consequence of this idea the average "man in the street" has put aside such studies as not being useful, practical, or belonging to the moneymaking side of life.

It has also been drummed into his ears that all such studies bordered on witchcraft and were in some way or the other associated with the Devil.

Being brought up to go to church every Sunday and hearing every time he went that he was "a miserable sinner", doomed to punishment and torment both in this life and the worked to come, he in the end believed that he was "a miserable sinner", and so dared not seek for any knowledge that might enable him to shake off the chains of conventionality and customs that ground him down and kept him in mental and intellectual slavery.

He had perhaps no means of knowing that some of the greatest kings of the world owed their success and wealth to advice given by their Astrologers, or that the Egyptian Magicians had greater power than either priest or potentate. He had perhaps never read that the great Queen Elizabeth consulted her astrologer and

palmist, Dr. John Dee, on all important matters of State, and that the destiny of England had been guided from time to time by those students of occultism whom he had been taught to believe were but fit companions for black cats, and were workers of the Devil.

He had perhaps never read of that great English astrologer, William Lilly, who had, predicted the Fire of London fifteen years before it took place, or that the House of Commons had called him before that great assembly believing that, as he had predicted the calamity with such accuracy, he could explain to them what had caused such a catastrophe.

Further, his English History had never told him that Charles-I had given the first thousand pounds his government sent him to Hampton Court to the same Lilly, the astrologer, asking him to predict his fate, and that had the King taken the warnings given to him by Astrology he might never have lost his head and descended to posterity as Charles the Martyr.

Again, it is probable he never knew that Queen Anne maintained an astrologer upon the roll of the Privy Purse, and that she had such faith in the celebrated Von Galgebrok that she asked him to predict the year of her death. This he did with perfect accuracy three years before the event, which took place on the 1st August, 1714.

Life is but the child of Mystery—we know not its origin — we know not its end. We see "as in a glass darkly" the threads of Destiny weaving the known and the unknown — and we wonder why.

We feel there is Design in all things — but it is only in looking back on the past that the wonders of "the pattern" become manifest.

We are indeed "of little faith", we children of men. We forget that we were made "in the image and likeness of God", and, in the forgetting, we have sold our birthright for "the mess of pottage" of man-made beliefs.

We do not dare to think of ourselves, for our "teachers" alone have wisdom? But alas! they locked the doors of knowledge, and the keys have rusted for want of use.

Behind all-the Gods of patience—the God of Eternity—waits.

Slowly the ages pass: "A thousand years are but a day". Nations rise and fall. Teachers come and go. Time weaves Destiny into Design until in the end Perfection shines through the wrap and weft and the God-thought underlying all becomes manifest.

If, then one of the so-called "occult studies", such as I have tried to explain, has helped, in no matter how small a degree, to call attention to those hidden laws of life that illustrate the Divine Design, then when "the Call" come—I will go my way, content that the years of study I have given to this work were not wasted and were not in vain.

I have seen so many wrecked and broken lives, where, had the people possessed even a slight knowledge of their own dispositions, they might have been saved, that I have felt it a duty to publish in a cheap and simple form the indications of character and tendencies which may be easily learned by a study of these "periods of birth", as set forth in the following pages.

I believe that any aid that may help towards the observation of character is not only useful but even essential

if one wishes to keep ahreast and succeed in this age of everincreasing competition.

Those people who have some means at their command to learn their own characters and the dispositions of others must certainly be thrice armed in the battle of life, and consequently more successful than the people who know nothing of such things. Therefore, I have no hesitation in saying that with this book in one's possession, one has a means towards winning success and also happiness.

With even a slight knowledge of what I designate in these pages as Life's Natural Affinities, the road to the divorce courts would not be so crowded as it is at present, parents would more easily understand their children and children their parents, and a great deal of suffering and friction might be avoided.

In conclusion, I trust I am not presuming too much when I venture to hope that this unpretentious volume may be the means of helping a large proportion of my fellow-beings to realise that in the study of the mysteries of life we are giving praise and glory to the Creator of Life, who in his infinite wisdom created all things to be used by man for the highest development of his kind.
