

He taught them to love and to help each other. He told the parents that they should teach their children not to fight.

He told his people that when they helped each other, it was the same as helping God.

Abinadi

Later, the Nephites had another king. His name was Noah, and he was a wicked man who did not obey Heavenly Father.

> Abinadi was a prophet of God. He came to King Noah and taught him and his wicked priests about Jesus.

Alma

Alma was one of the priests of King Noah. Alma believed the teachings of Abinadi and left King Noah to go and teach the people the things that Abinadi taught.

He knew that if the Lamanites learned about Jesus, they would stop fighting the Nephites, and they could all be friends.

> Ammon went to the king of the Lamanites. He asked to be the king's servant because he wanted to help him.

The king said that Ammon could help tend the king's sheep. While Ammon was tending the sheep, some mean men came and tried to steal the sheep.

Ammon protected the king's other servants and saved the sheep.

The king was very happy. He asked Ammon why he was so strong and good. Then Ammon taught the king and his people about Jesus.

The People of Ammon

Many of the Lamanites believed Ammon's teachings and wanted to follow Jesus and be friends with the Nephites. They learned that they should share and not fight anymore.

They buried their swords and bows and arrows in the ground and promised to never fight again.

> To be safe, they moved into the Nephite lands, where they lived in peace for many years.

The Army of Helaman

Many of the Lamanites did not believe Ammon when he taught them about God, so they still wanted to fight the Nephites

The Nephite soldiers needed more help. The grown-up boys of the good Lamanites said that they would help.

They were only babies when their parents promised never to fight again, so these young men had not made that promise. They asked the prophet Helaman to be their leader. They were not afraid to fight even though they were young.

> Their mothers had taught them to trust Jesus and promised them that if they would do what was right, God would protect them.

Samuel the Lamanite

Samuel was a Lamanite and a prophet. He went to the Nephites and told them that Jesus was going to be born in just five more years.

> He said that when Jesus was to be born, a new star would appear in the sky and there would be a day and a night and a day when it wouldn't get dark.

Some of the people believed him and were very happy that Jesus would soon be born.

> But some people were angry with Samuel and tried to kill him. Heavenly Father protected Samuel so that their arrows could not hit him.

Jesus Is Born

Five years after Samuel taught the people from the city wall, the star that he promised appeared in the sky. Other great lights also appeared.

When the sun went down that night, it didn't get dark. That was how the people knew that Jesus had been born far across the sea in the land of Jerusalem.

Many people were very happy and hoped that Jesus would also come to the Promised Land to visit them.

Jesus Is Crucified

Thirty-three years after the signs of Jesus' birth were given, many people had forgotten about Jesus and were being cruel and wicked.

They had become selfish and would not share with or help other people.

> When Mormon became the leader of the people, he taught them to be good, but the people said no!

Mormon had been given all the books of the whole land. He read the books and then wrote the most important parts on a new set of golden plates.

> He wrote about Lehi and Nephi and about Alma and Abinadi. He especially wrote about Jesus and how much Jesus loves us.

Then he gave the golden plates to his son, Moroni, and told him to take good care of them and keep them safe.

The Jaredites

Long, long ago, after Noah and his family and all of the animals got off the ark, the people started to build a talltower.

They hoped it would be tall enough to reach to heaven. This made Heavenly Father unhappy with them, and he changed their language so they could not understand each other.

A man named Jared lived at this time. Jared and his family prayed to be able to still understand each other.

They were good people, and Heavenly Father told them he would lead them to a promised land. They traveled for many days. Finally they came to the sea.
