

'Masonic bias' in police job move

A police officer was discriminated against because he was not a Mason, an employment tribunal has ruled.

Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve Constable Joseph Gibson was moved from the motor transport depot in 1999 during staff cutbacks.

Another reservist who was retained was not as well trained as Mr Gibson but was a member of the Masonic Order.

The tribunal ruled Masonic Order membership was a religious belief

The Fair Employment Tribunal held Mr Gibson was unlawfully discriminated against on grounds of religious belief.

It also held that the constable retained was a member of the Masonic Order, as was at least one other person involved in the selection process.

In a ruling the tribunal declared: "The respondents did not provide a neutral working environment. As a result, those officers who did not belong to the Masonic Order felt uncomfortable and excluded because of the actions of those who did."

The tribunal will reconvene to decide upon the appropriate remedy.

The tribunal said membership of the Masonic Order is a religious belief for the purposes of the Fair Employment and Treatment (Northern Ireland) Order 1998. The tribunal concluded "the decision to transfer the claimant from the RUC Motor Transport Depot was unlawful discrimination on grounds of religious belief".

Mr Gibson brought the case before the tribunal, with the assistance of the Equality Commission.

Judgement studied

Eileen Lavery, head of legal services in the Equality Commission, said people could not be discriminated against because they were not Masons. "The ruling of the tribunal is clear - that in the workplace it is unlawful to discriminate against someone because they are not a Mason," she said. "It does not say that membership of the Masonic Order is incompatible with any particular employment, but rather that taking decisions in the workplace which favour one person to the detriment of another, based on Masonic membership, is unlawful."

Mr Gibson, now 67, originally from Belfast, took the case against the RUC - which has since become the Police Service of Northern Ireland - and the now defunct NI Police Authority after being among the officers selected for transfer.

The staff reduction followed a decision to switch prisoner escort duties to the Prison Service. A spokeswoman for the Police Service of Northern Ireland said the force was studying the judgement closely.

Despite its cultural importance, BISHOP NAZIR-ALI remains adamant that no mention of this notoriously secretive organization should exist inside THE CATHEDRAL. He told The Church of England Newspaper: "I fully appreciate the sensitive position which the new Dean is trying to resolve, and support him in his efforts to find a way forward in recognizing the contributions of individual donors to the fresco. When it comes to Freemasonry as an institution, however, I base my views on a Church of England report, Freemasonry and Christianity, endorsed by General Synod, which found that Freemasonry is incompatible with Christianity." Postscript: the Chair of the Salisbury Diocesan House of Laity

MFRFM wishes to acknowledge the kindness, courtesy and goodwill with which so many Deans of the Church of England have responded to this Survey. Their patience and their willingness to commit time and trouble to providing information has been remarkable. Thanks are also due to Mr. David Williams, the Clerk to the General Synod, who earlier this year provided a list of Synod Members upon payment of the requisite fee of £25 and who, always courteous and helpful, confirms that he has shared the Report with members of the Central Secretariat. All praise is due to Brigadier CMG Elcomb OBE who as Chapter Clerk to Salisbury Cathedral has extended every courtesy to MFRFM, sending two very detailed answers to the guestionnaire. By contrast, an e-mail dated 19.9.06 from the Chair of the Salisbury Diocesan House of Laity - the Diocesan Office is directly opposite the Masonic Hall - appears rude and (in the light of the fee paid for a list of the Synod membership) inconsistent. It reads: "Please remove my name and email address from your database immediately. Your email [copy of Report] is an unsolicited and unwanted communication which if repeated will lead to my reporting the matter to the Information Commissioner." James Humphery is a senior member of the Synod, a former member of the Diocesan Board of Finance; he sits on the Clergy Discipline Commission and on the panel of diocesan chairmen. He publishes his e-mail address in the Church of England Year Book 2006. He ignored (without demur) an earlier Submission in 2006, itself circulated by arrangement with Mr. Williams, calling for a register of Masonic clergy. (NB: Caroline Windsor's 2005 "Attitudes to and Experiences of Freemasonry within the Church of England." Ms Windsor is a member of Truro Diocesan Synod. To the question "Do you believe that Freemasonry is compatible with the Priesthood?" 65.6% of Archdeacons/Area Deans/Rural Deans and 67.7% of Deliverance Ministers replied "No". Also note Dr. Rowan Williams' letter to me dated 9.8.02 describing his own misgivings as to compatibility.) The hostile e-mail backed up by a little bit of threatening will do little to dispel the perception of the Church of England among some of its critics as a private members' club ceding too much control to white, middle-class males who do not welcome transparency. Independent rational observers will be left in perplexity as to how a process which has received the courteous attention of the Clerk to the General Synod of the Church of England and been generously assisted by the Chapter Clerk to Salisbury Cathedral (on behalf of the Dean) can be treated with contempt by a representative elected to represent the same Diocese of Salisbury. James Humphery is not the only citizen of Salisbury whose behaviour seems inconsistent. On 24.7.03, the Revd Canon June Osborne, then Acting Dean of Salisbury, wrote that "it is not our intention to repeat" the kind of Masonic Service held in June 2002. Now she is Dean of Salisbury and we learn that there has been an EVENSONG FOR FREEMASONS on 1.10.06.

We are grateful to the Registrar of the Diocese of Oxford for a follow-up letter dated 22.9.06 supplementing the much earlier e-mail from the Dean of Christ Church, Oxford. What a welcome contrast with Mr. Humphery's manners. Other Deans have replied recently.
