Westenberg presents a clear, documented chronicle of the activities that preceded and followed Max Heindel's designation as messenger for the Brothers of the Rose Cross. The author begins with the earliest origins of the Rosicrucian Order, includes a synopsis of the Masonic legend, and takes us to the early Rosicrucians of the 17th Century. The biography spans the life of Heindel from boyhood until his final days at Mount Ecclesia and reviews the years that followed the passing of Augusta Heindel.

Truly an extraordinary figure, Heindel founded The Rosicrucian Fellowship 100 years ago, on August 8, 1909.

A final chapter reveals the method of how one may come in contact with the Order of the Rose Cross which, unknown to the world, performs its salutary work. The first addendum contains the three Rosicrucian manifestoes newly translated into English from the earliest extant documents.



The eldest son of a liberal protestant family, Gerrit Westenberg was born in 1933 in Amsterdam, Holland. Since his retirement in 1998, Westenberg spends most of his time translating or re-translating the Heindel books into the Dutch language.
