## *Preface*

With the great printing centers of Rome and Venice disposed of in volume II of this catalogue, we now come to the smaller cities and towns of Italy, some of them (Florence, Milan) not so small, with a fairly extensive output, others (Foligno, Genoa), with but one or two printers who produced very few books. These smaller presses are not too well represented in the various Harvard libraries, and indeed some of them (such as those at Mondovì and Como) are not represented at all. But it is in the nature of small enterprises to print editions in limited numbers and for the sale and circulation to remain for the most part local. Rarity can therefore be taken for granted, and not only in our own time. Richard Ashhurst Bowie, whose library is one of the great treasures of Harvard, noted in 1881 that it had taken five years for a German bookseller to find him a copy of Curtius Rufus's *Historia Alexandri Magni* (see no. 3061); and on another occasion he complains, "I sent an order for [Censorinus, *De die natali*] to Germany in 1875, but nearly five years elapsed before a copy was offered for sale" (see no. 3234). One hesitates to think how long Mr. Bowie would have to wait for his order to be filled were he to be trying to acquire such books today.

These small presses did not always restrict themselves to pamphlets or books of local or occasional interest, however. An example is the Foligno Dante of 1472, of which Harvard, despite Charles Eliot Norton's collecting efforts in the 19th century, does not have a copy; nor was Oppian's *Halieutica* (Colle de Valdelsa, 1478) included in Daniel B. Fearing's extensive collection of books relating to fishing, gathered by him over a long period of years, largely in the late 19th century. And were such rarities to come on the market today, they would probably be priced far beyond our means, for gone are the days when a Harvard librarian could record the acquisition of

an incunable in 1837 with the laconic notation "Cost 50 cents." Nevertheless, despite lacunae of this kind, the Harvard collection of non-Roman, non-Venetian Italian printing can be considered distinguished, with a number of books of which no other copies are recorded in the United States and even one or two that appear to be unique (see, for example, no. 3124A). Many of the greatest rarities are to be found in the magnificent collection of incunabula formed by James Frothingham Hunnewell and deposited in the Harvard College Library by his son, James Melville Hunnewell.

A glance at the list of references prefixed to this volume will reveal how deeply I am indebted to Dr. Dennis E. Rhodes of the British Library for his many books and articles dealing with printing in the smaller cities and towns of Italy. Over nearly forty years Dr. Rhodes has been using his sharp eye and inquiring mind to shed light on and solve many a problem of dating, type-identification, and assignment of books misdated and misassigned by authorities less acute than he. All incunabulists are in his debt; it is a pleasure to acknowledge my own.

I continue to be grateful to my colleagues in other Harvard libraries for their cheerful cooperation in making the incunabula in their care available to me, and to the administration of the *Gesamtkatalog der Wiegendrucke* in Berlin for their willingness to answer my numerous queries. Once again, I thank Dr. Paul Needham for giving me the benefit of his expert knowledge in matters of provenance.

### PRELIMINARY NOTE TO PADUA

The Printer of the 1471 Mesue has traditionally been described as the first printer in Florence, and five of his productions are recorded in BMC 6:615–16, with a sixth described by Dr. Dennis E. Rhodes in an article, “Ancora per lo stampatore del Mesue,” in *Studi offerti a Roberto Ridolfi* (Firenze, 1973, p.[407]–12). Ridolfi, in his article “Lo ‘Stampatore del Mesue’ e l’introduzione della stampa in Firenze” (*La Bibliofilia* 56 (1954): [1]–20) shows convincingly that the Printer of the 1471 Mesue was Laurentius Canozius in Padua, which town therefore takes precedence of Florence in the annals of printing.

## Florence

### PRELIMINARY NOTE TO FLORENCE

Because of the practice of Florentine printers of the 1490s and their successors to continue using types and woodblocks that began life in the fifteenth well into the sixteenth century and to fail to date their books, I may very well have included in this section a number that should properly be excluded from a catalogue of incunabula. Dr. Dennis Rhodes of the British Library has done much to clear up uncertainties of dating in many individual instances, but even he has not been able to cover the entire field of Florentine printing, and much more remains to be done than I can undertake in the limited amount of time I can devote to each printer. I have felt justified, however, in departing from my general rule of not giving detailed descriptions of post-1500 books in a number of cases where the book has been listed by many authorities as an incunable and is rare enough so that only a few copies have been recorded but never adequately described. I have, however, excluded a number of post-1500 Savonarola tracts of no great rarity. Of these a list will be found at the end of this section.

I can give no transcriptions for this apparently unique fragment, since all before leaf c2 and all after q3 is wanting. However, according to Max Sander, this edition agrees page for page with that of 27 July 1495 printed by Lorenzo Morgiani and Johannes Petri, of which a type facsimile was issued by the Roxburghe Club in 1910; it is from that and from Sander's description of the 1495 edition that the above collation has been constructed. As for who printed this book and when, the type is certainly the 114G used by Jacopo di Carlo and Bartolommeo di Libri in Florence; but Di Carlo was active for only the relatively short period 1487–90, whereas Di Libri started in 1482 and went on printing through the first decade of the sixteenth century. For this reason I suggest him as the possible printer. Ten of the woodblocks used in the *Epistolae* were also used in the Italian version of Pseudo-Bonaventura *Meditationes vitae Christi* printed by Miscomini about 1493, where their state shows their precedence. Two further editions of Pseudo-Bonaventura with the same woodcuts are dated by GW ca. 1495 and ca. 1496 (though Goff dates the latter ca. 1500), in which, according to Sander, "le tirage des bois est sans doute postérieur" to the impressions in our *Epistolae*. However, Sander goes on to point out, it is not impossible that the 1495 and 1496 dates assigned by GW to the Pseudo-Bonaventura editions are too early and that they may very well have been printed at the end of the fifteenth or even the beginning of the sixteenth century, in which case our *Epistolae* would date from the same period or slightly before.

Since these corrections and additions are described as “factum cum exemplari proprio ipsius fratris Angeli” and since they have been made in the Venice edition of Georgius Arrivabenus dated 4 June 1492 (see no. 2129 in vol. 2), which is stated to be “correcta secundum primum exemplar ipsius Angeli,” it is clear that the printing of these 16 leaves must antedate that edition. The corrections are keyed to the first edition (Chivasso, Jacobinus Suigis, 13 May 1486; see no. 3584) but could be used for other editions as well (“Vel si non habes predictam summam impressam clauasij sed aliam impressam uenetiis vel alibi,” etc.). This apparently unique book has been assigned to the press of Cris-tannus Preller because it contains, at end, a device identified by BMC (6:873) and Husung (no. 69) as belonging to Antonius Gontier, a Neapolitan publisher and printer. (On various interpretations of the initials found on the device see Fava-Bresciano I:103-04.) This device does occur in a Landino of 21 May 1490 printed with Preller's types for Gontier, but the types used in the present missal are clearly those of Mathias Moravus, not Preller, and so I assign the work to him, though this is contrary to the references given below, all of which (except Copinger) question Preller as the printer. I see no reason why Gontier, in his capacity as a publisher, should have restricted himself to a single printer.

Representing one of the largest collections of incunabula in the western hemisphere, this catalogue will become a basic reference tool for all students of European civilization in the fifteenth century. The descriptions provide information about format, size, binding, illuminations, marginalia, bookplates and labels, and imperfections, as well as contents, names of editors and translators, and variants, together with cross-references to other standard catalogues.

Like its predecessors, this volume includes representative plates and indices to authors and anonymous titles, editors and translators, printers and places, provenances, concordances, and identifiable bindings. These indices will be cumulated in the fifth and final volume, which will also include a history of the collection.
