Novel Influenza A (H1N1) Key Events 18 May 2009 1100 EDT



- Novel Influenza A (H1N1) Declarations
 - HHS: Downgraded to Phase 1 Awareness (9 May 2009)
 - WHO: Pandemic Phase 5 (29 Apr 1600 EDT)
 - USG: Public Health Emergency declared (26 Apr 2009)
 - SLTT Declarations: 10
 - CA, TX, WI, FL, NE, VA, MD, IA, OH, American Samoa
- US Cases:



- International Cases: 8,480 confirmed cases in 39 Countries.
 - Countries with new confirmed cases: India, Malaysia, Turkey
- Deployments: 81 deployed, 5 pending, 208 potential (200 DGMQ)



Epidemiology/Surveillance Number of Novel Influenza A (H1N1) Cases Reported to CDC by State as of 18 May 2009 1100 EDT





- Current situation
 - 82 confirmed or probable HCP cases
 - 23 states



International Novel Influenza A (H1N1) – 18 May 2009 1100 EDT



- WHO global case count: 8,480 confirmed cases in 39 countries*
 - New countries with confirmed cases: India, Malaysia, Turkey
 - India: 24 y.o. returning from NY
 - Malaysia: 21 y.o. returning from US, onset 5/14
 - Turkey: 26 y.o. American symptomatic in Istanbul airport
 - Countries with highest confirmed case count after the US and Mexico:

• Canada: 496 (=)

Spain: 103 (↑3)

• UK: 82 (↑4)

Panama: 54 (†11)

- 45/82 cases (55%) in UK are in-country transmission (Source: ECDC)
- First cases of in-country transmission reported in Japan
 - Media reporting rapid rise in confirmed cases, particularly in Kobe and Osaka
 - Schools ordered closed in Kobe
