

Why Do ALL Churches Teach that Satan is More Powerful Than Jesus Christ?

Every church teaches that God is omnipotent, omniscient and omnipresent. They teach, “nothing is too hard for the Lord” (Gen 18:14). They teach that God is all-powerful!

“I am the Lord. There is none like Me.” Isa 45:5

“Nothing is impossible with God.” Matt 19:26

Churches also teach that Satan, apparently with no special effort on his part, tempted Adam and Eve, whose “fall” brought sin and death to the **entire human race**. **One temptation by Satan turned ALL mankind into sinners.**

But, Jesus Christ came to earth as a *man*, as one of us, and throughout His ministry, He was attacked, disbelieved, accused of being a fraud, ridiculed, and ultimately humiliated, beaten, and executed in the most cruel manner possible. He paid the ultimate price! He was nailed to the cross, willing to sacrifice His life for ALL sinners.

Yet, Jesus Christ, according to church teachings, will only be able to save “some.”

Satan made **ALL** humanity sinners – but Jesus Christ will only be able to make **some** - not **ALL** – righteous!

That means that Satan is more powerful than Jesus Christ!

But that cannot be!

So, what is the answer? Are the churches misrepresenting the power and authority of Jesus Christ. Are they teaching that Satan will be the Big Winner in the end? Jesus said He came “to take away the sin of the world.” (John 1:29)

Will Jesus Christ FAIL in His mission?

Has Jesus Christ lost control of His creation? Has Jesus Christ lost control of Satan?

Can Satan, a created being, outsmart God?

In the first and second chapters of the book of Job, the Bible tells us that Satan cannot do anything other than what God allows. So, if God **allows** it, that makes it God's **will**.

Therefore as by the offense of one (Adam) judgment came upon ALL men to condemnation;

Even so by the righteousness of one (Jesus Christ), the free gift came upon ALL mankind unto justification of life. Romans 5:18

Adam's sin caused ALL mankind to become sinners

For as by one man's (Adam's) disobedience (the) many were made sinners

Jesus Christ's death on the cross saved ALL mankind

For by the obedience of one (Jesus Christ) shall (the) many be made righteous. Romans 5:19

The Greek words hoi polloi used in this passage, mean "the many" – not "many." The phrases used here represent Adam – and everyone else (the many), and Christ – and everyone else (the many).

"The many" refers to ALL. We know that Adam's sin led to the whole human race becoming sinners. God is tell us that through Jesus Christ's death on the cross, **the whole human race**, eventually, will be justified (made righteous).
