As the Government of the United States of America is not in any sense founded on the Christian religion ...



It has been asserted that Washington did not write the famous words that the United States of America is not in any sense founded on the Christian religion, and that this quote was inserted in the Treaty in Tripoli by the American Ambassador. This assertion, that apparently dates to the 1920s, claims the Tripoli copy of the Treaty does not have the quote at all.
