 I was delighted to see my book about Indonesia mentioned on p.49 of the latest edition of Lonely Planet Indonesia. Unfortunately the title is incorrect- it should be 'In the Time of Madness' not 'Madness Descending'.
- Mar 10, Roxanne Cole,
 Vegetarian's write the word "VEGETARIAN" onto a piece of paper and show this
 to restaurant staff. Found it impossible to pronounce vegetarian so that locals
 could understand. If Indonesian's see the word written down then they understand
 straight away.
- Apr 10, Hans Gerber,
 The location of the central immigration office is indicated incorrectly on the Jakarta map (point "4"). The CENTRAL immigration office is somewhere else anyway, near the Malaysian embassy, but it doesn't do visa extensions. The full adress of the RELEVANT immigration office for visa stuff is: Kantor Imigrasi Klas I Jakarta Pusat, Jl. Merpati Blok-B12 No.3, Kemayoran, Jakarta Pusat 10720. Note that this adress looks similar to the one mentioned in the book. But it is located in the Kemayoran district, north-east of Merdeka Square, not south. It took me a whole day of taxi odyssee to find that out...

 Admission Fee for the waterfalls has increased to 50'500 Rp for foreigners. But there is a great shuffle service by motorscooters from Dago (25'000 Rp single 50'000 Rp return). It's fun too!
- Nov 10, Alexandra Griesmeier,
 Borobudur; the best connection to yogyakarta's busterminal in jombor from
 malioboro road is to take bus 3A and then change to 2 B. the person in the bus
 tells you where to change. bus nr. 5 to jombor is not reliable and turns up all 2
 hours or so. tourist information in yogya recommended the lines 3a and 2b. it
 worked perfectly. we waited for bus 5 nearly an hour and gave up. The best bus
 back from jombor to malioboro road is 2A. Concerning fares from Jombor to
 Borobudur we didn't work out, how much it cost. we paid 10.000 Rp on the way to
 borobudur. on the way back we paid 20.000 Rp. no way to find out the tariffs...

 Just a small note that I wanted to let you know, the bird market in Yogya has moved to somewhere just outside of the city (somewhere between 5 and 12 kilometers away- depending on which of the touts you speak to). Apparently the government was concerned about bird flu and wanted it outside of the central area. Cheers!

 Yogyakarta: The Pasar Ngasem (bird market) has been moved by the
 government. It is not located at the JL Polowijan anymore. According to some be
 becak divers the government has done this to make the entrance to the Taman
 Sari more visible for tourists. And to make the place more open. The Bird market
 is now located just off the map (page 177) at A6 if you follow the JL Wahid Hasym
 to the south. It is located at the east side of the road. Though I can not compare it
 to the old bird marked it was still worth a visit.

211	Jul 10, Joe Le Merou, Semarang: Metro Hotel; Name of the hotel has changed. It's now called "New Metro Hotel"		
214	Jul 10, Joe Le Merou, Hotel rawa pening eltricia is now called "Azaya". If you ask for Hotel rawa pening, the bus will drop you at another place, 100 m from the right one.		
214	Jul 10, Joe Le Merou, Gedung Songo; Price is now 25 000 for foreigners. 5 000 for locals.		
227	Jul 10, Joe Le Merou, Surabaya: The business class Malang Ekspress doesnt exist anymore (again ;))		
235	Jun 10, Michael Luethi, Melang tourism Ambassadors do not exist anymore. The telephone number is out of order and at the address given there is now a guesthouse. We asked sunrise holidays about the whereabouts of them and they told us that at the moment there is no trace of them.		
247	Nov 10, Wiebe Vijn, Probolinggo approach: 3rd paragraph (starts with: "If you want to just hike to Bromo"): There are no white stone markers for the walk to the crater. In fact there are rows of white stones or square pillars but they serve to keep out the jeeps and other 4 wheel cars of the direct environment of Bromo. Those rows of white pillars are in fact a fence and when you follow these pillars you come close to Gunung Batok at one side and going to the other side it leads you to probably Gunung Kursi. if I could send you a photo I made you would understand it immediately.

For a room with fan we payed 300.000 rupiah per night no matter how we bargained. We showed the book with the price op 150.000 per night. The reaction was that the visit of Lonely planet was three years ago and that prices have gone up because everything has to be imported from the main island these day.
307	Aug 10, Gerald van der Wijngaart and Deirdre Veen, We visited quite a few temples in and around Ubud. The prices to enter the temples has gone up from 6.000 rupiah per person to 15.000 rupiah per person.
369	Nov 10, Magdalena Janowski, The ferry is no longer running between Penang and Medan as it was to expensive to run On November 23ed, 2010 I tried to buy the ferry tickets and was inform of this new development.
379	Aug 10, Carolien van Zuilekom, I was in Bukit Lawang in July 2010 and, unlike as is written in the guidebook, it is no longer possible to buy a permit for the feeding sessionat the entrance of the park. I almost missed the feeding session because of this, so please change this for the sake of other tourists. The only place to buy a permit to enter the park for a feeding session is the Bukit Lawang Visitors Centre. You already mention this centre in the guide. Because of the change in the permit policy, the PKHA Permit Office as you describe it on page 378 does no longer exist. They only check your permit, but they don't sell them.
394	Aug 10, Carolien van Zuilekom, In the guidebook is written that to get from Danau Toba to Berastagi, you have to take a bus to Pangururan and then to Berastagi. That is correct, but the trip from Pangururan to Berastagi does not take 3 hrs, but at least 5hrs, mainly due to really bad road conditions. After 3 hrs we were only in Sidikalang, about halfway the journey.

Feb 10, Els Mellink, 430 We have been traveling across Sumatra and eventually came to Padang. We wanted to go to the Mentawai Islands from there, but had a hard time finding a place to buy the boat tickets. We couldn't find the place that was suggested by the Lonely Planet to buy the tickets (Bevys Sumatra in the Batang Arau Hotel) even though we spend the entire morning looking for it. The next day we spent another morning looking for another ticketing agency and finally found a place at the harbour. We took the boat to the Mentawai on tuesday morning instead of monday night because of bad weather, and expected to take the boat back on friday, since everyone said that there would be a boat going back by then. But it turned out that the boat wasn't coming and there was no way of getting of the island and going back to Padang until tuesday, when the next ship came. Because of that we nearly missed our flight out of Indonesia. I think that it would be a good idea to tell travellers that the scheduled ships from and to Pedang often don't go and to be prepared to have to stay on the island several more days and to bring enough mon-

661	Aug 10, Lisa Godden, The immigration office moved in 2005. It's now far from the centre and you need to get a taxi or pete-pete. However the process to extend my visa on arrival was reasonably efficient and was ready the day after I dropped it off. Feb 10, GEOFF DE BURCA, 839 Here's some up to date info on how to get an Indonesian visa in Dili, East Timor, for those planning a visa run (I did this in December 2009). Step 1: Be Prepared: Before you head down to the embassy, you'll need a passport photo taken with a RED background (no, I don't know why either), a photocopy of your passport and a letter explaining how long you want the visa for (30 or 60 days) and a rough outline of what you plan to do. Apparently this can be handwritten, but it's probably safer to type one up. All of these can easily be sorted in Dili if you don't have them before you arrive in the country. Step 2: Get up early: The embassy may open its doors at 8.30am, but that doesn't mean that's when you should turn up. They only process about fifty a day, and considering there are lots of East Timorese people applying as well, this means you should really get into the queue at the front gate at around 6am (which is what I did, and I was 14th in the queue). Step 3: Fill in your forms: While you wait for the doors to open a security guard will pass you the forms through the gate, which you need to fill in with a BLACK pen (again, don't known

The official website of Pelni, the national shipping company, has always been www.pelni.co.id, not www.pelni.com which is in the book. www.pelni.co.id is kept up to date though somewhat erratically, schedules are usually only uploaded up to a month in advance so if one has no luck checking for a far-away date, searching for within the next month may still bring results.
