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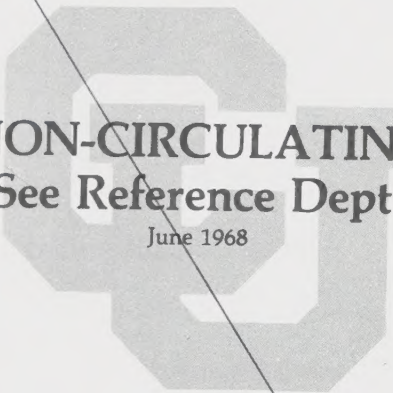

A Note from the Publisher

The State Atlas of Political and Cultural Diversity is a unique reference. It provides the first detailed data on a subject of great importance—the relationship of race, ethnicity, and ancestry to politics in the American states.

The atlas could not have been done without modern computer software that made it possible to juxtapose massive amounts of racial, ethnic, ancestral, and socio-economic data with an equally massive database of 6,744 state legislative districts. Nor could this atlas have been done without the existence of *The Almanac of State Legislatures*, published in 1994, which created a methodological platform of digitized district boundaries and their socio-economic complexion. Also, the precursor volume pioneered the adaptation of four-color processing techniques that are so important in making this volume's many maps so clear and so rich in data.

With a growing interest in state and local politics, both books represent a rich lode of information for scholars, legislators, the media, and others. The authors and Congressional Quarterly have prepared a computer disk that contains for each of the 6,744 state legislative districts the precise percentage of population of each of the fifteen racial, ethnic, and ancestral groups under study in the printed volume—no matter how small the population percentage. The disk also contains average household income, percentage with college education, and percentage receiving social security in each of the districts. This disk is available from Congressional Quarterly Books.

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INTRODUCTION

The State Atlas of Political and Cultural Diversity is a unique analysis of U.S. Census data, using sophisticated computer technology, to show precisely how fifteen of the nation's largest and most important racial, ethnic, and ancestral groups, as designated by the U.S. government, are distributed among 6,744 state legislative districts.

Taking the African-American population as an example, the atlas provides precise, comprehensive maps showing the state house districts and the state senate districts with 50 percent or more African-American population, with between 25 percent and 50 percent African-American population, and with between 10 percent and 25 percent African-American population. Accompanying the maps are tables showing the average household income of those districts, the percentage with college education, and the percentage receiving social security.

This one-volume road map performs the same sociopolitical function for all fifteen groups. They are:

- African-American
- American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut
- Asian or Pacific Islander (and the three most important Asian sub-groups)
 - Chinese
 - Japanese
 - Korean
- Hispanic (and the three most important Hispanic sub-groups)
 - Mexican
 - Puerto Rican
 - Cuban

- German
- Irish
- Italian
- Polish
- Arab

We had two reasons for creating this atlas. First, it reflects our belief that race and ancestry have become increasingly important in explaining American politics. That might not be what a majority of Americans want to believe, but the authors think it is true nevertheless. Second, we believe that political power is moving away from the federal government back to the states.

As to the importance of race and ancestry, we echo here for the nation what V. O. Key, Jr., said of the states in his seminal book, *Southern Politics* (New York: Knopf, 1949): “The question of race overshadows all other factors conditioning the politics of the South.” We believe today, almost fifty years after the publication of Key’s book, that race, ethnicity, and ancestry affect American politics more than ever. Major reasons for this are the massive northern migrations of southern blacks and the large influxes via immigration of Asians and Hispanics—Mexicans, Puerto Ricans, Cubans, and others.

These old and new *non-white* population groups are competing for economic and political turf with the older and more established *white* ancestral groups—the Germans, the Italians, the Irish, and the Poles—but the terms of the competition are not even. Defining the unevenness is the fact that the older, European-based white groups—which initially tended to cluster geographically—are now dispersed and assimilated more or less evenly throughout the population, while the newer, non-white groups tend to live in certain areas and not assimilate.

We are well aware that this dispersal-clustering phenomenon can be attributed to “time in the country” for the non-white groups just as it was for the white groups. Nevertheless, we set ourselves the analytical task of calibrating the degree and location of clustering for each of the groups. The resulting maps and tables present a picture of each group’s potential political power in state legislatures. Accordingly, we converted the degree of group clustering into a quantifiable “Geo-Political Concentration Index” and we have correlated group wealth and group education levels with group propensities either to concentrate or to disperse within the nation’s state legislative districts. (See Part II, p. 23.)

The atlas shows with great precision which state political districts have either dominant or very significant population clusters of non-white groups. It shows that the older, European-based white groups are the predominant racial-ancestral groups in most state political districts, but because those white groups have assimilated more or less evenly throughout the population their potential political power is dif-

fused over many districts while the non-white political power is more concentrated and potentially more effective. The atlas calibrates that degree of diffusion for several of the major European white groups.

Returning to the second reason for creating the atlas, the political trend in the United States is away from the strengthening of federal government institutions and toward the strengthening of state government institutions. State governments will be performing many tasks that the federal government once handled and will be dealing with problems that involve race and ethnicity.

The book shows in multicolor maps which state legislative districts—based on percentage of population—may need to be particularly responsive to African-American concerns, Puerto Rican concerns, Mexican concerns, or German concerns. The socio-economic tables accompanying the maps suggest how that district's levels of income, education, and dependency might shape those concerns.

Part I consists of twenty-eight maps that show for fourteen of the fifteen sizable racial and ancestral groups the state house and senate districts in which those groups constitute 50 percent or more of the population, 25 percent or more of the population, and 10 percent or more of the population. The maps are shown two-to-a-page, with the state house maps followed by the state senate maps.

The section captures in a fourteen-page snapshot how the potential political power of these groups is distributed across the state legislative districts. It begins with an essay discussing the national and regional significance of these political-power distribution maps. The essay, inevitably, concentrates on how and where the non-white groups have concentrated and how and where the white groups have diffused.

Part II has fifteen sections, one for each racial, ethnic, and ancestral group, and includes more detailed, close-up maps of state house and senate districts where the group has 50 percent or more of the population, 25 percent or more of the population, or 10 percent or more of the population. Accompanying these national and regional close-up maps are tables that rank for the group the state house and senate districts from the greatest to the fewest in population percentage. African-American, Asian, Hispanic, and American-Indian population percentages use 1994 data; all other categories and subcategories use 1990 data. These tables also include precise data on average household income per district, average percentage of population with a college education per district (percentage of population aged twenty-five and older with at least a two-year college associates degree), and average percentage of population receiving social security per district (percentage of households receiving social security income). Data for these three measurements are from 1990. These data and the maps enable the reader to see at a glance the essential socio-economic makeup of any legislative district with a large population block of one or more racial or ancestral groups.

For the groups with many state legislative districts in which their populations

are statistically significant—by our definition only the African-Americans, the Germans, and the Irish—the tables list only the top 1,000 house and 1,000 senate districts. For the African-Americans, the cut-off point is 15.7 percent of the population in house districts; for the Germans, the cut-off point is 29.0 percent of the population in house districts and 16.8 percent of the population in the senate; for the Irish, the cut-off point is 12.5 percent in the house districts. For all the other racial and ancestral groups, the tables go down to 10.0 percent of the population of the house or the senate district.

In an effort to produce the most comprehensive study to date of race and ancestry in American state politics, we have prepared a computer disk that contains for each of the 6,744 state legislative districts the precise percentage of population of each of the fifteen racial and ancestral groups under study in the printed volume—no matter how small the population percentage. The disk also contains average household income, percentage with college education, and percentage receiving social security in each of the districts.

Methodology

Perhaps the most critical methodological issues were the *choice* and *definition* of the fifteen major racial and ancestral groups. As many experts in this contentious field know, the assignment and calibration of racial, ethnic, and ancestral characteristics becomes more difficult as the country becomes more interracial, more interethnic, and more interancestral. Acknowledging that fact leaves aside questions concerning what precisely is “race,” what precisely is “ethnicity,” what precisely is “ancestry,” and how should one measure these groupings. We have not attempted in this volume to shed further light on these serious long-standing intellectual controversies. Instead, we have accepted the definitions of the U.S. Government as reflected in the 1990 Census. For those who wish to know how the Census Bureau reached these assignment points and how the Census measured for them, we recommend *U.S. Census of Population and Housing, 1990, Technical Documentation Summary, Tape File 3* (May 1992), pages B-1 to E-15. These chapters show how the Census assigned ancestry, for example, “Irish”; ethnicity, for example, “Hispanic”; and race, for example, “African-American,” “American Indian,” or “Asian.”

The Census questions that interested us dealt with ancestry, race, and ethnic origin. When respondents answered the ancestry question, they could list one or more groups, such as German and Irish, or English and Irish, or Scotch and Irish, as representing their ancestry. We classified respondents according to the *first* ancestry listed. When respondents answered the race question, they could choose one category from 1) white; 2) black; 3) American Indian, 4) Eskimo, 5) Aleut; or 6) Asian or Pacific Islander, with Asian including Chinese, Filipino, Hawaiian, Korean, Vietnamese, Japanese, Asian Indian, Samoan, Guamanian, or other Asian categories.

When respondents answered the question on Spanish/Hispanic origin, they were asked to classify themselves as Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, or other.

We excluded several of the largest ancestral groups cited by respondents—English-Americans, Scottish, Scotch-Irish, and American—because the population numbers were so large *and* so diffuse. In other words, when we looked at maps of English-American distribution, we saw that English-Americans were assimilated to such a degree as to be the very opposite of a cohesive political group. We excluded ancestral groups such as the Swiss, the Austrian, the Welsh, and the French because we concluded that they also lacked sufficient political cohesion as an actual or potential American political force. We made the opposite judgment call, informed largely by our sense of American political history, to include the German, Irish, Polish, and Italian ancestral groups. We recognize that these are our judgments and that others might disagree with them.

In *The Almanac of State Legislatures* (1994), the basic building block was the digitization of the nation's 6,744 state legislative district boundaries. Before publication of the almanac, no single volume contained *all* the precise geographical boundaries of *each and every* state senate and house districts in the United States.

We recreated the district boundaries using data provided by state government agencies and state universities in all fifty states. The data came in various formats: some states have geographical information system divisions, which keep boundaries in various types of computer digital formats. Other states have lists of geographic areas, such as census blocks, matched to political districts and stored on paper or computer disk. Still others use written descriptions of the boundaries: turn left at Main Street and proceed south to the railroad tracks. There were truly fifty different methods used to represent the districts. For a few states, only a simple computer file conversion was performed, but for others boundaries were drawn street-by-street on the computer screen.

One of the difficulties encountered was the large number of inconsistencies and missing boundaries discovered when maps, written descriptions, lists of blocks, and the actual redistricting law were compared. An official map might show a district's boundary going in one direction, but the written description put it somewhere else. Most of the time, state officials were unable to resolve these problems, and calls had to be made to cities and towns to get correct information. Sometimes a trip to a local courthouse was the only way to determine the true boundary.

Data from the 1990 U.S. Census were used to create the tables. Digitized census block groups boundaries—containing between 250 and 500 households—were overlaid with the political boundaries, and the data within those block groups were aggregated into the political districts. In a few cases where a political boundary split a block group, a percentage of the group's data was allocated to each district on the basis of the group's land area. Therefore, in some districts the number displayed on the table is not an exact count but a close estimate. The tables give a good sense of the demographic makeup of each district and allow comparisons to other districts in the state or region.

Political Representation

We attempted to link group population concentration with actual political representation, but were not surprised that our efforts yielded fragmentary results. Turnover is rapid among the 7,424 state legislators; not only are there frequent elections, but also elected state legislators rarely make a long-term career of these positions. Moreover, no organization—government or private—is responsible for recording the race, ethnicity, and/or ancestry of the current crop of state legislative office holders.

We have left the researching of this important information to the many scholars around the country who are interested in these related topics. We believe that the atlas establishes a solid base for future investigation, and we offer what information we were able to glean from the offices of the National Conference of State Legislators (NCSL). For African-Americans, the NCSL, along with the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies, reported in February 1995 that there were 557 African-American state legislative office holders, or 7.5 percent of all 7,424 seats. For American Indians, the NCSL reported in 1994 that there were 44 self-designated American Indian elected representatives, or 0.6 percent of all 7,424 seats. For Asians and Pacific Islanders, the NCSL reported in 1994 that there were 53 self-designated Asian Americans serving as elected state legislators (or 0.7 percent of all seats) and that 47 of the 53 were serving in the Hawaiian state legislature. For Hispanics, the NCSL reported in 1994 that there were 155 self-designated Hispanic state legislators, or 2.1 percent of all 7,424 seats. We thank the people at NCSL for sharing these data with us and appreciate what they were able to capture from this very large, very opaque, and very rapidly moving target.

Finally, this atlas represents a methodological testimony to the power of modern computer software technology. Only computer software could have made it possible to juxtapose so much racial, ethnic, ancestral, and socio-economic data with the geo-political envelopes of the 6,744 state legislative districts in the United States.

Of the many people who have helped us develop our geo-political mapping capability and our ability to analyze large data bases, eleven individuals have been especially generous over long periods of time. We take this opportunity to thank Derek L. Crawford, John R. Dunham, Alfredo Filippone, David I. Greenberg, David G. Laufer, Michael H. Moskow, John Roberts, Joshua J. Slavitt, Matthew J. Stover, Ronald F. Stowe, and William A. Testa. Also, we once again had the good fortune to work with Congressional Quarterly's top publishing team—Patrick Bernuth, the general manager of CQ Books, and Nancy A. Lammers, its director of editorial design and production. As in our first book on state legislative districts, the heavy lifting in the critical computer mapping areas was done by Thomas L.C. Vail, Jr., and Peter W. Fleury. As before, Diane I. Ching, vice chairman and co-founder of InContext Inc., was responsible for much of the book's conception and design.

PART I NATIONAL POPULATION DISTRIBUTION AND STATE LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

The principal national findings of the 1990 Census regarding race and ethnicity in the United States are as follows: a little more than three-quarters (75.6 percent) of all Americans classify themselves as non-Hispanic white, 12.1 percent classify themselves as black (we use African-American in the atlas), 9.9 percent classify themselves as Hispanics (which according to the Census, encompasses all races—52 percent of Hispanics classify themselves as white), 3.4 percent classify themselves as Asian or Pacific Islander, and 0.8 percent as Native American. The Census also found that 18.4 percent classify their ancestry as German, 9.2 percent as Irish (almost the same percentage as Hispanics), and 4.5 percent as Italian.

Those numbers tell us little about potential political power at the state legislative level, but tables I-1 and I-2, drawn from the maps and tables in the atlas, tell us a good deal about potential political power at the state level. Table I-1, for example, tells us that African-Americans have not dispersed in large numbers all over the country. In other words, African-Americans have not participated fully in the suburbanizing and metropolitanizing of the nation's population; they have not spread out like the white population. Table I-1 and the more detailed tables in the atlas show—and surprisingly—that by not dispersing, African-Americans have gained a potential state legislative political power base greater than their percentage of the total population would indicate. To illustrate this point, contrast the German-American population-political power numbers with those of the African-Americans. The German-Americans have a 50 percent greater share of the total population, *but African-Americans have a majority in 100 percent more or twice as many state house districts.*

The Hispanics show many of the same non-dispersal characteristics as the African-Americans. And, like the African-Americans, Hispanics have participated less than other groups in the suburbanizing-dispersing of the population. For example, Table I-2 contrasts the Irish-American population-political power numbers with those of the Hispanics. Both groups constitute the same percentage of the total population—about 9 percent. But there are no house or senate districts in which the Irish-Americans constitute a majority of the population; the Hispanics do so in many. Just as important, the Irish-American have almost no house or senate districts in which they constitute 25 percent of the population; the Hispanics have many.

Table I-3 shows the difference in population-political power between the African-Americans and the Hispanics. The African-Americans have 20 percent more popula-

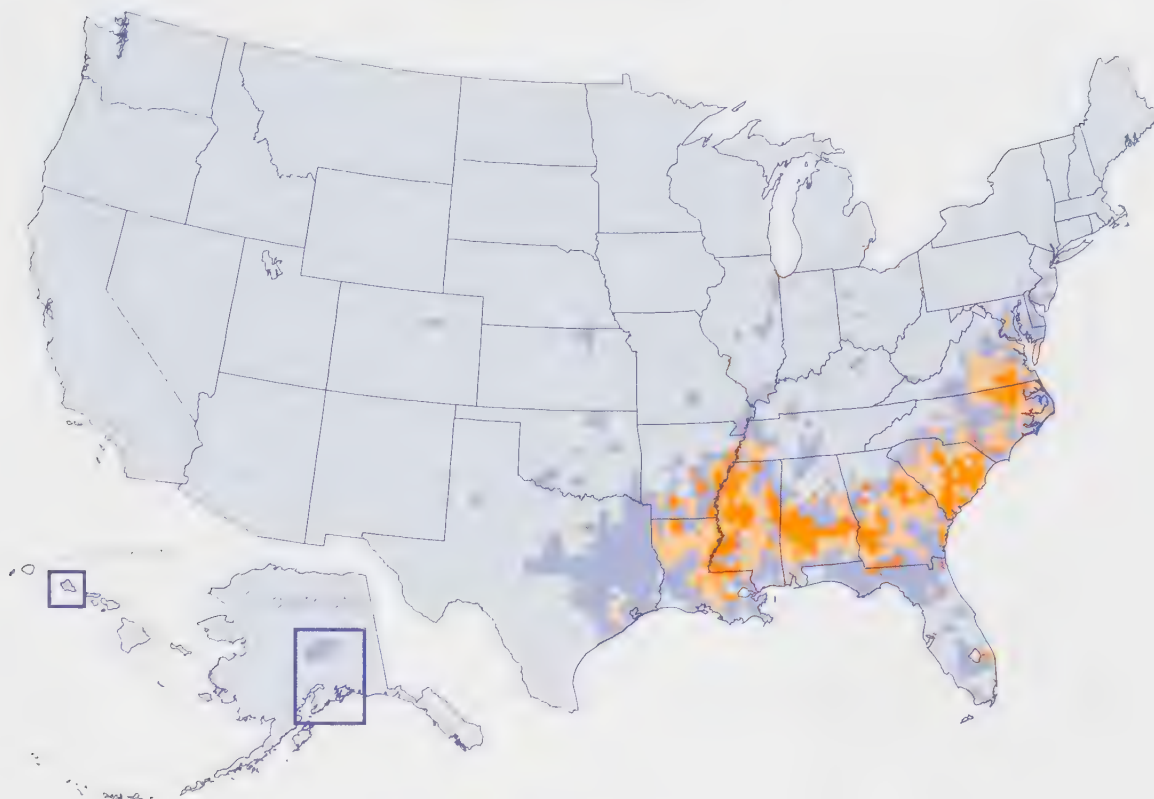
tion than the Hispanics, but constitute a majority in three times as many house and senate districts. The maps and tables in the rest of the atlas show that the Cuban and South American cohorts of the broader Hispanic cohorts have dispersed more broadly throughout the population.

Table I-4 shows the contrast in population-political power between two longtime ethnic rivals of American politics—the Irish-Americans and the Italian-Americans. The Irish-Americans have twice the population, and both groups are widely dispersed throughout the population and state legislative districts. Therefore, neither group has many senate or house districts with either 50 percent or 25 percent of total population. In other words, neither group is statistically dominant in any but a handful of districts. But the Italians, who typically arrived later than the Irish, hold a significant number of house and senate seats in the states where they initially settled and where they constitute more than 25 percent of the population—New York, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey. In other words, both the Irish and the Italians are dispersed, the Irish only more so.

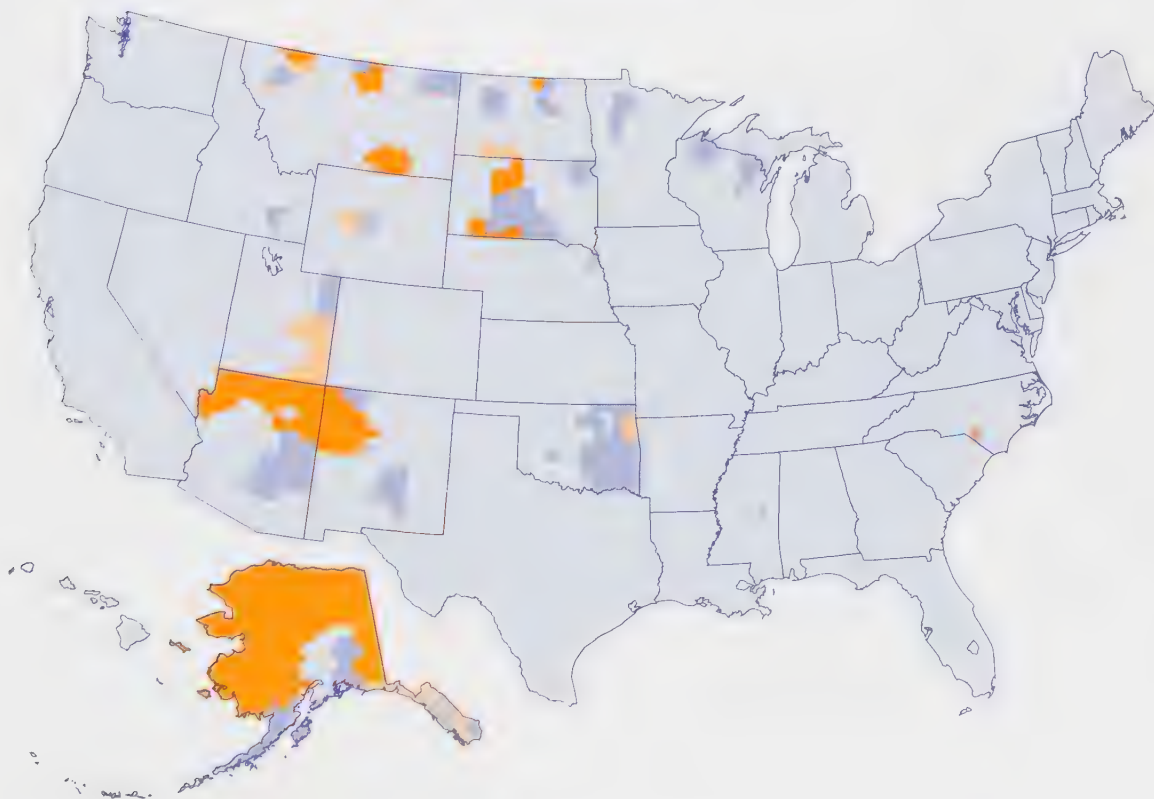
The maps and the tables—all at the national level—show another important and perhaps surprising reality of the relationship between population growth and political power. The media frequently report that the African-American and Hispanic populations are growing faster in the United States than the European-based white population groups. The implicit assumption is that these groups' political power will keep pace with their larger numbers. We find that this is not necessarily true. Potential political power will increase *only if the population group stays geographically clustered*. Once the population group—in this case, African-Americans and Hispanics—begins to disperse into the suburbs where most of the rest of the population resides, the potential power base will begin to dilute—just as it did with the Irish and the Italians.

Look again at Table I-2 which measures the potential political power of the faster-growing Hispanics with the potential political power of the slower-growing Irish. Both groups now have slightly more than 9 percent of the population. But the putative Hispanic power is enormous vis-à-vis Irish political power *only* where the Hispanics have not dispersed—and that is in those districts where Hispanics have more than 50 percent and 25 percent of the population.

AFRICAN-AMERICAN Top State House Districts



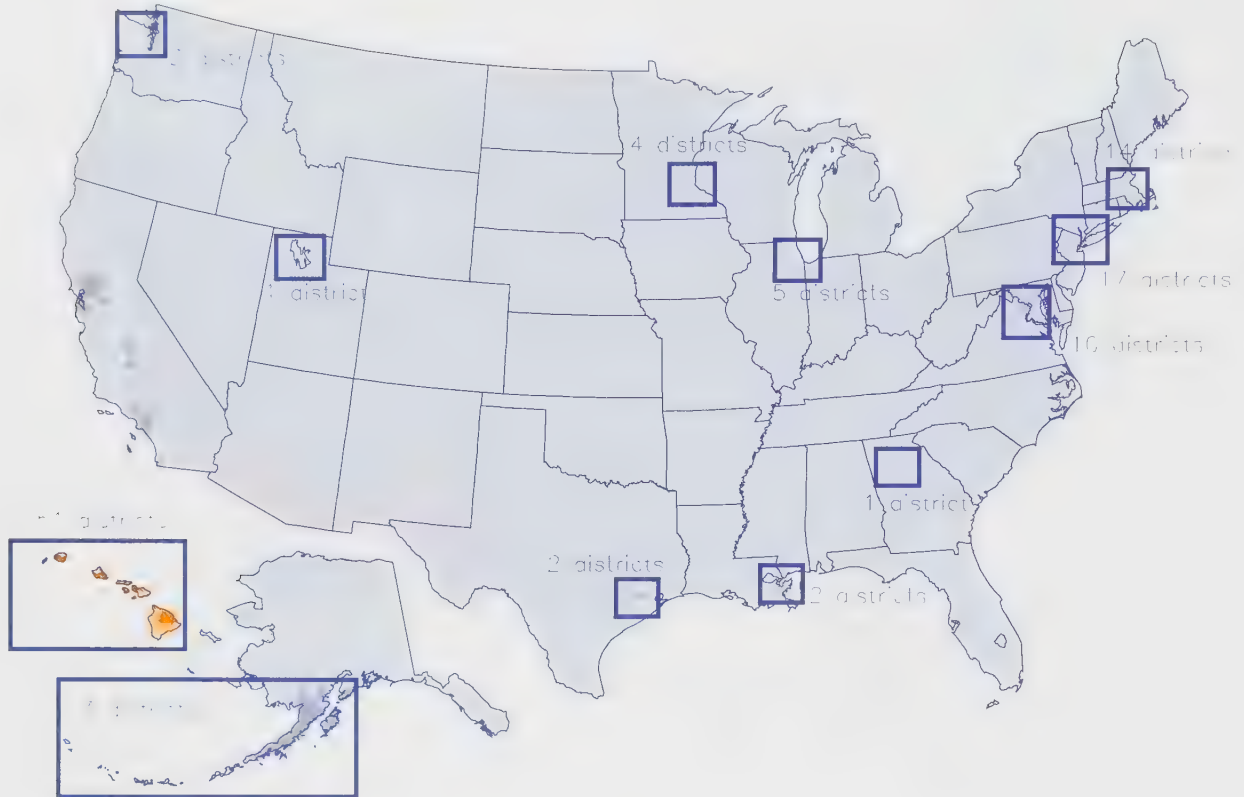
AMERICAN INDIAN, ESKIMO, or ALEUT Top State House Districts



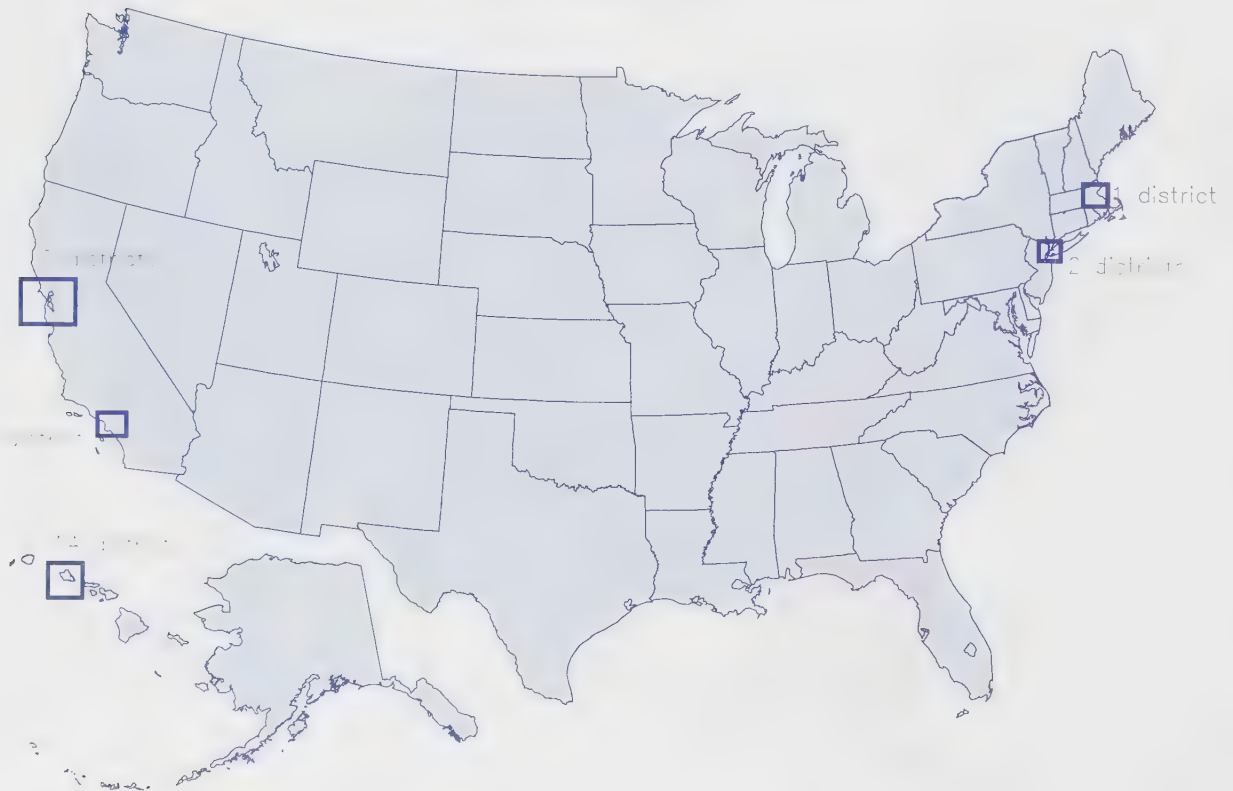

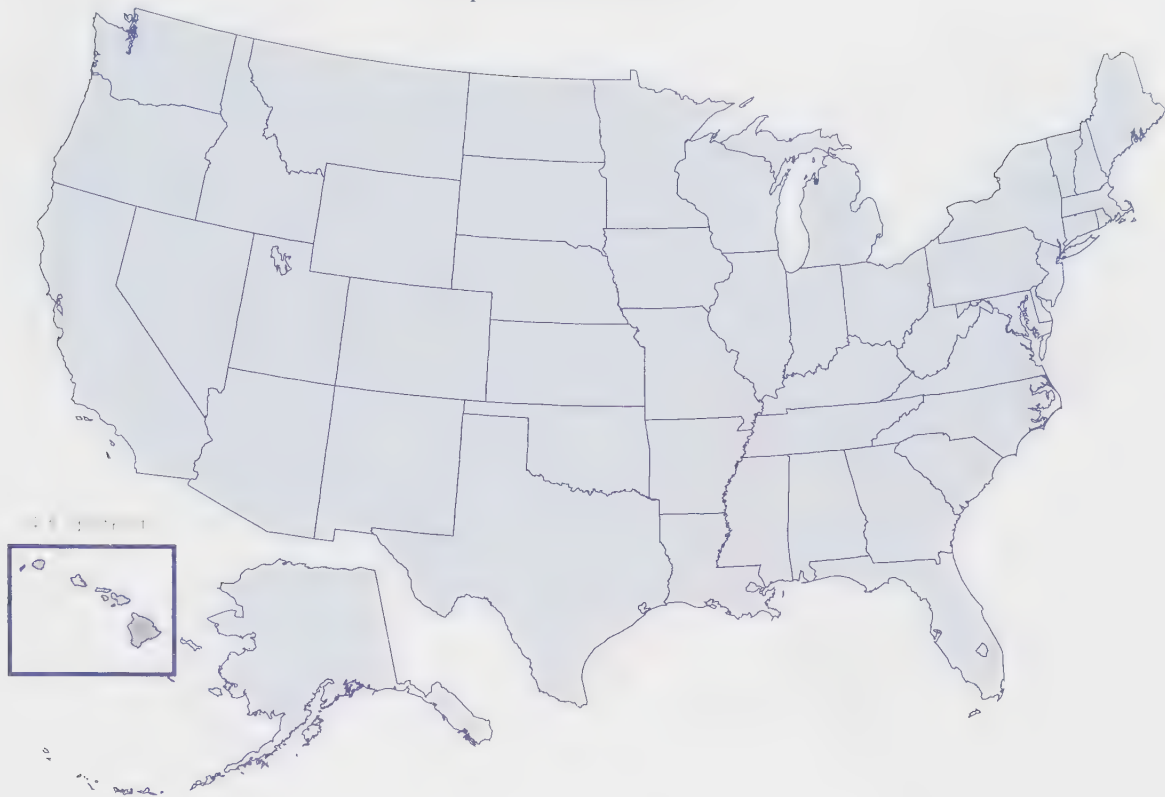
CHINESE Top State House Districts



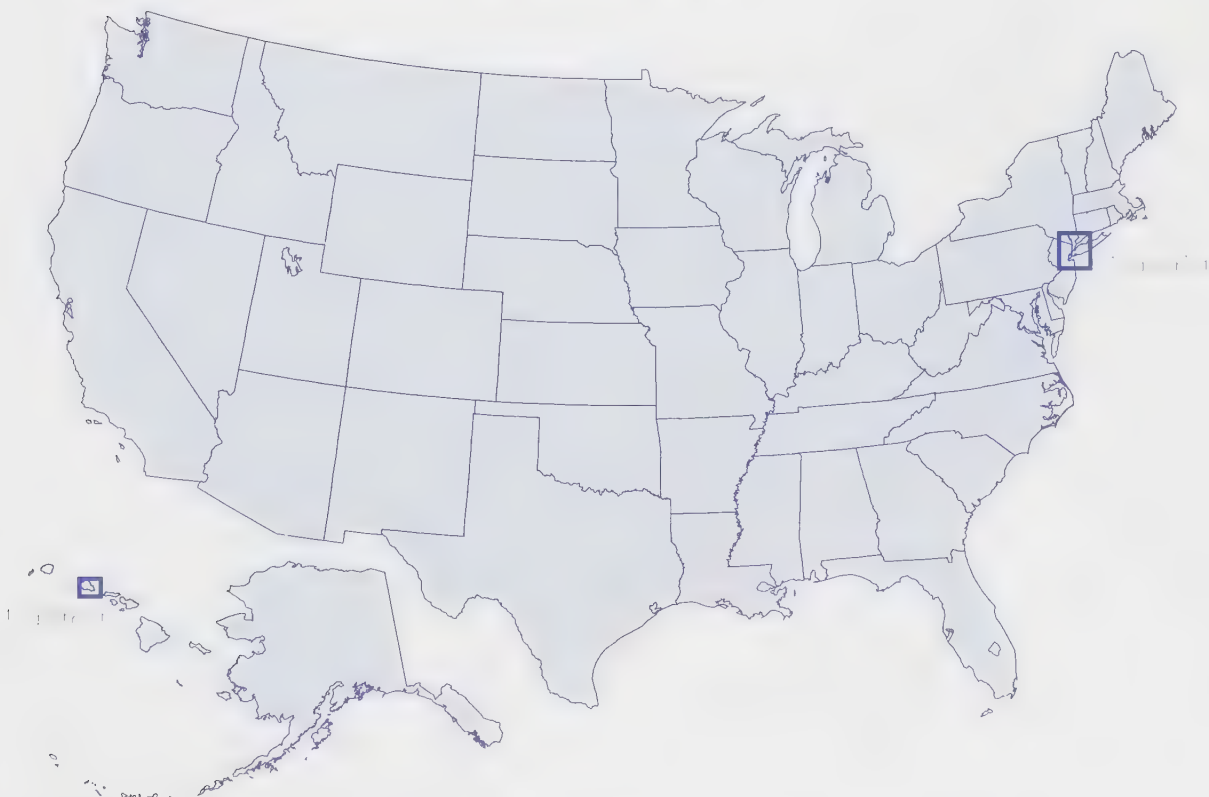

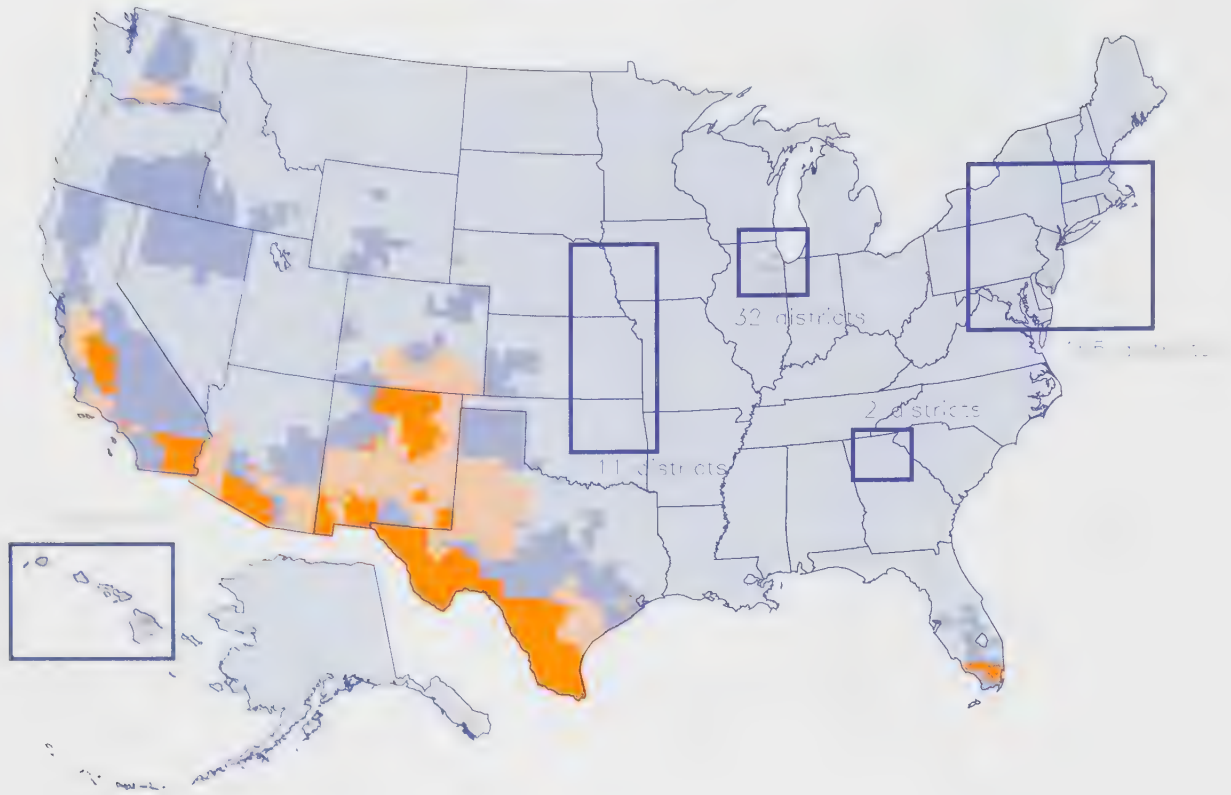

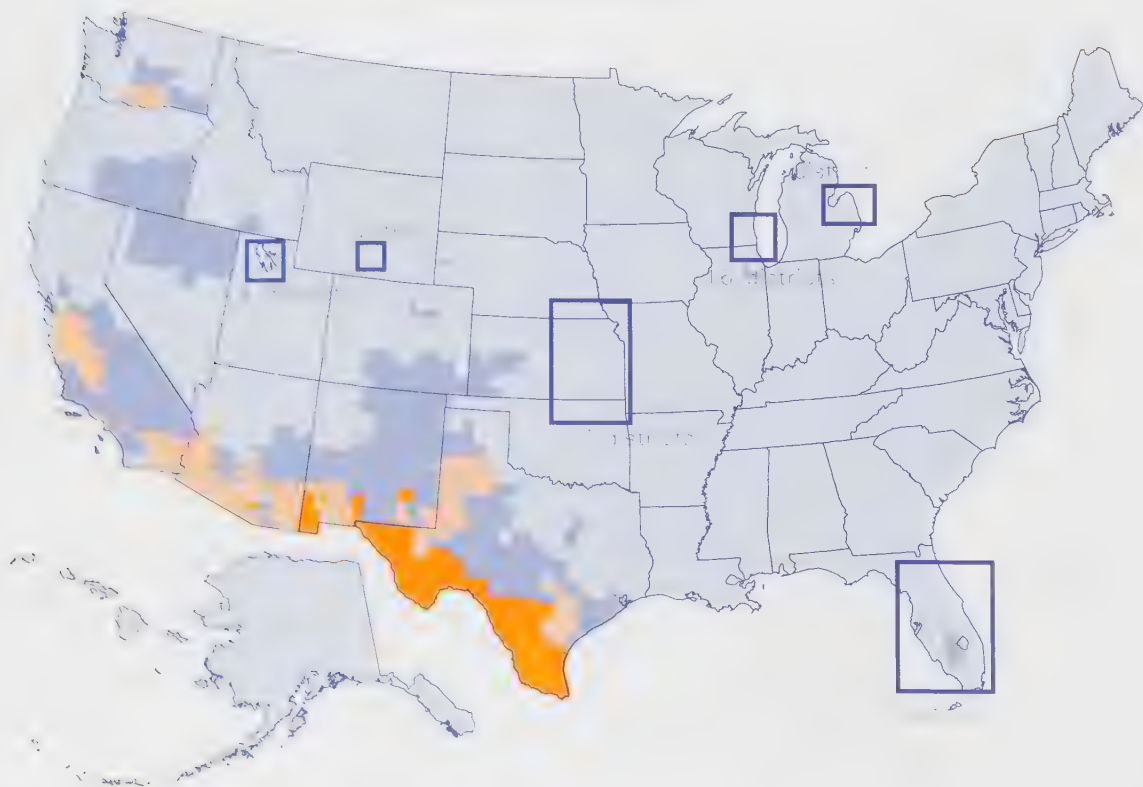

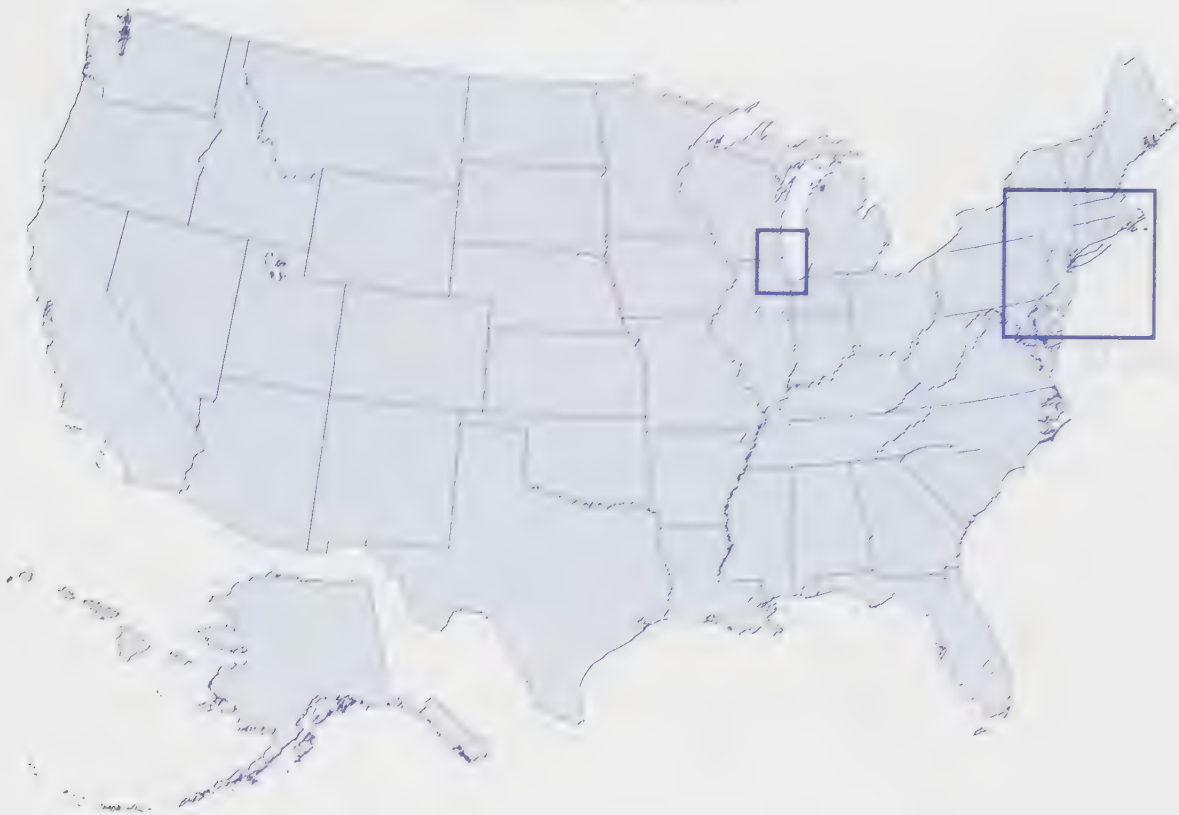

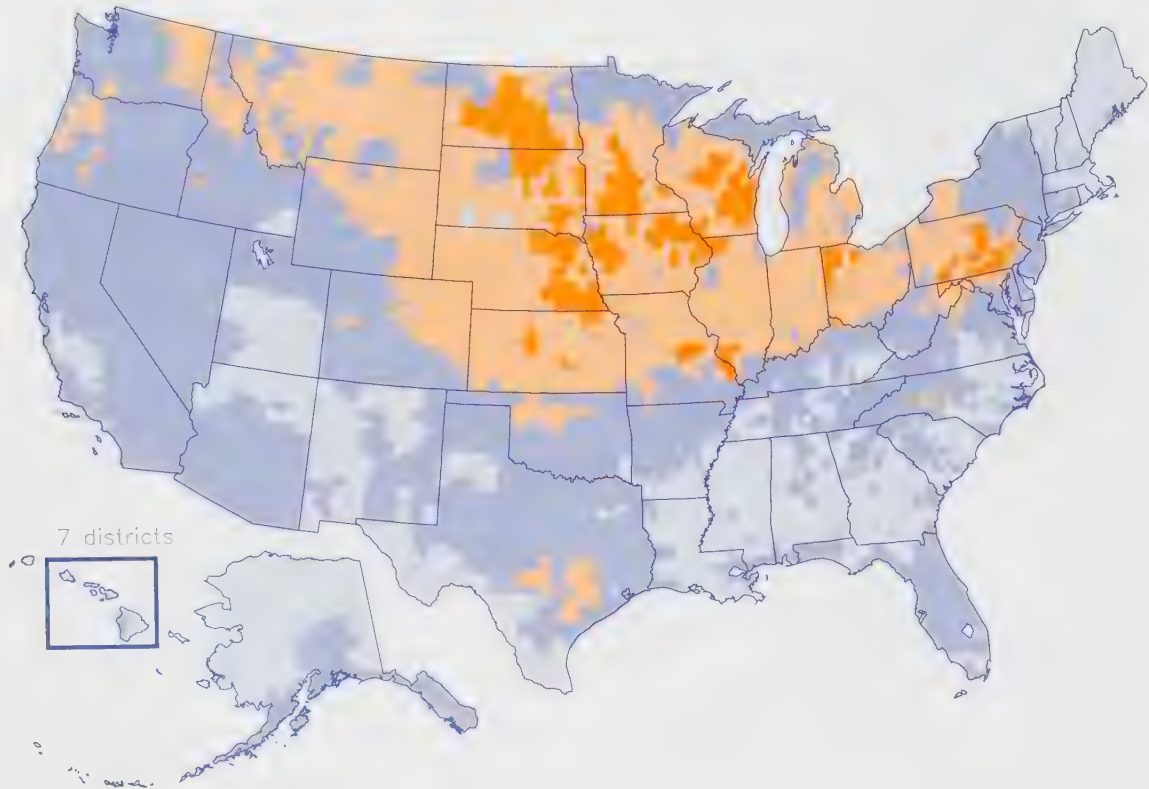

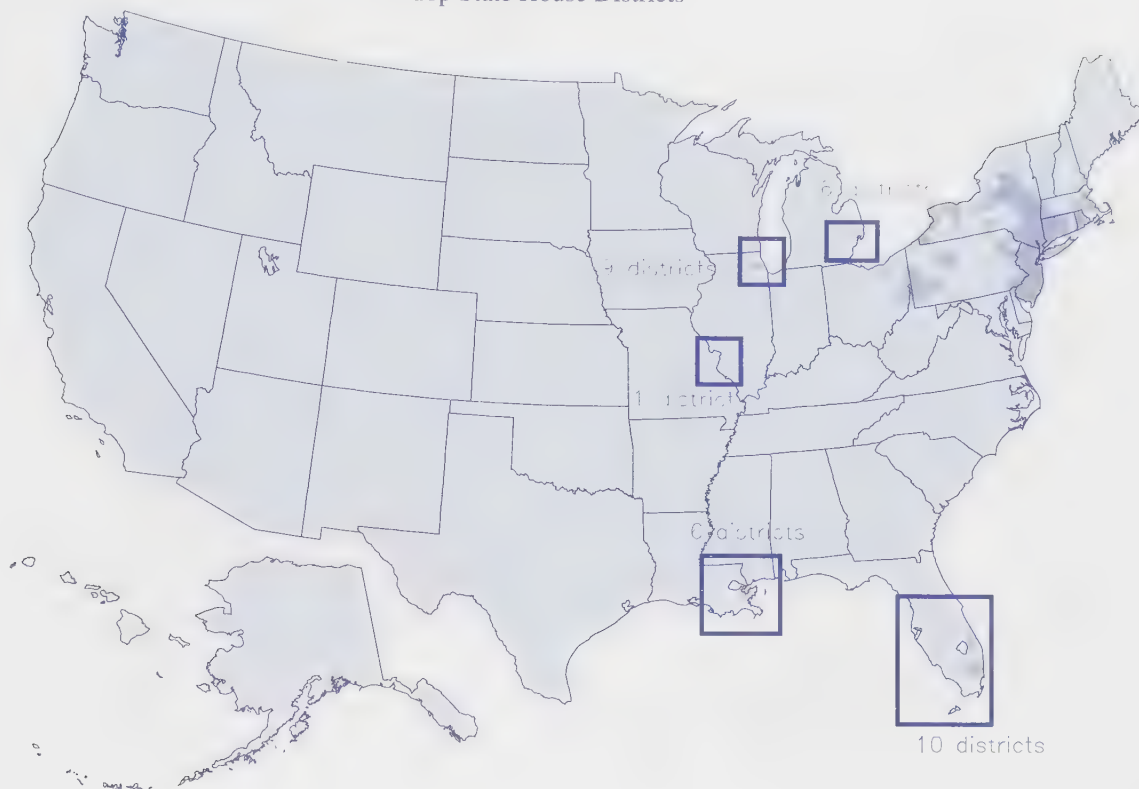

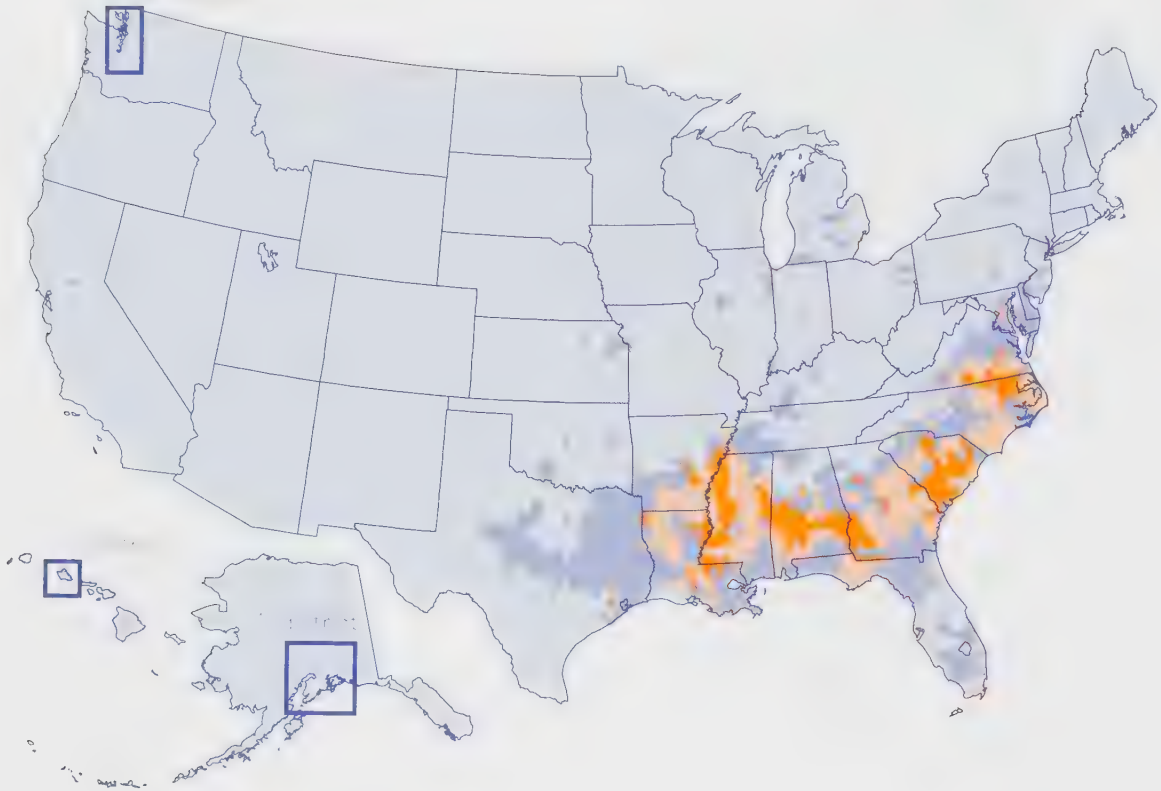

AFRICAN-AMERICAN Top State Senate Districts



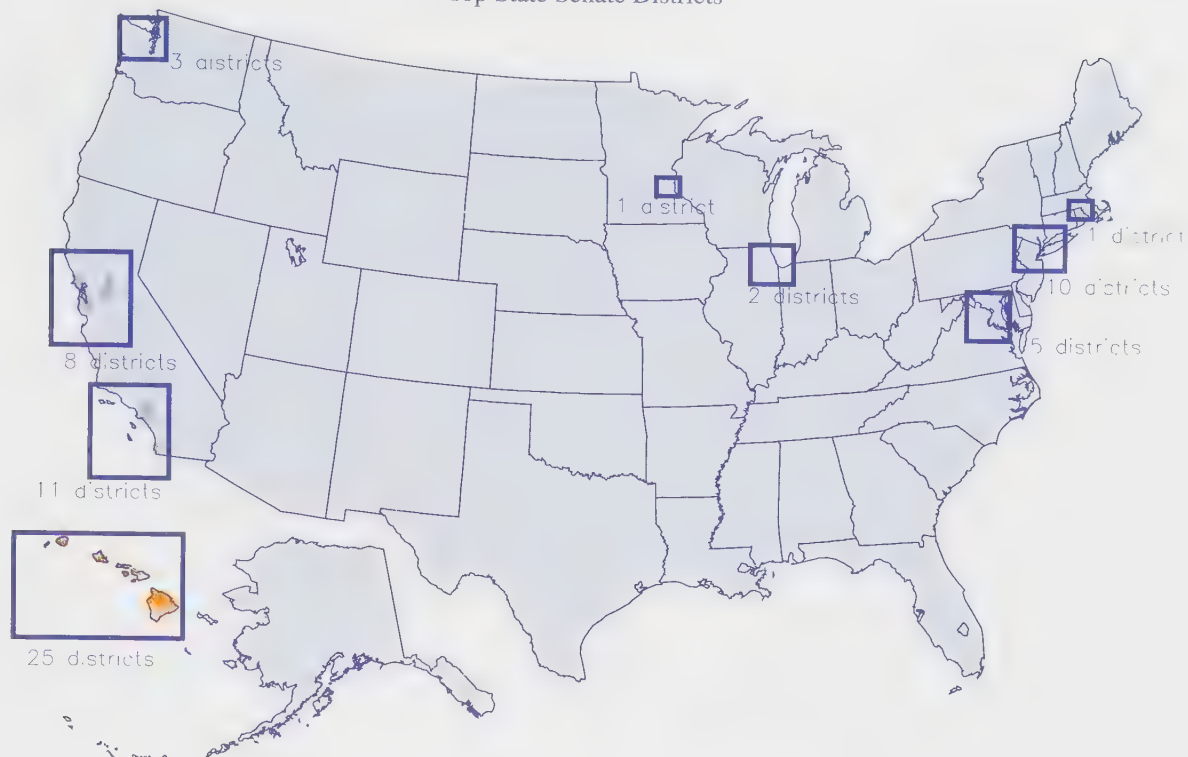

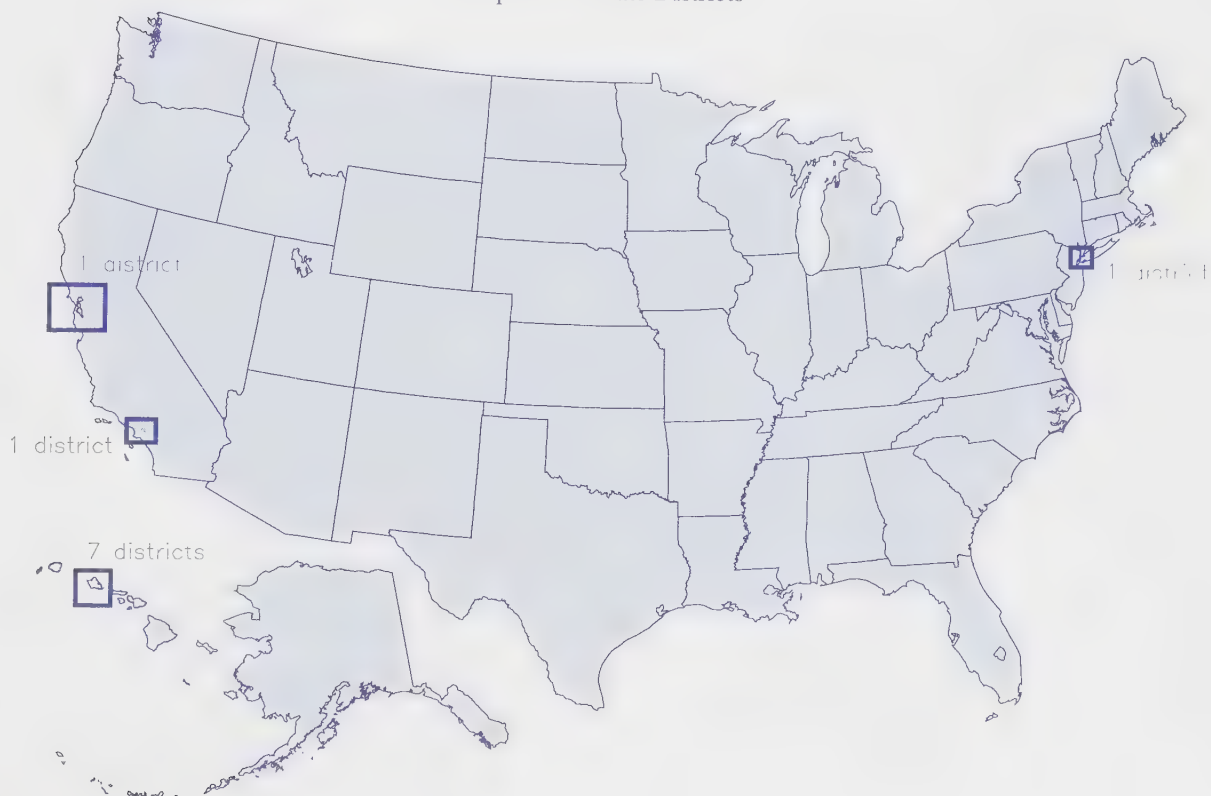

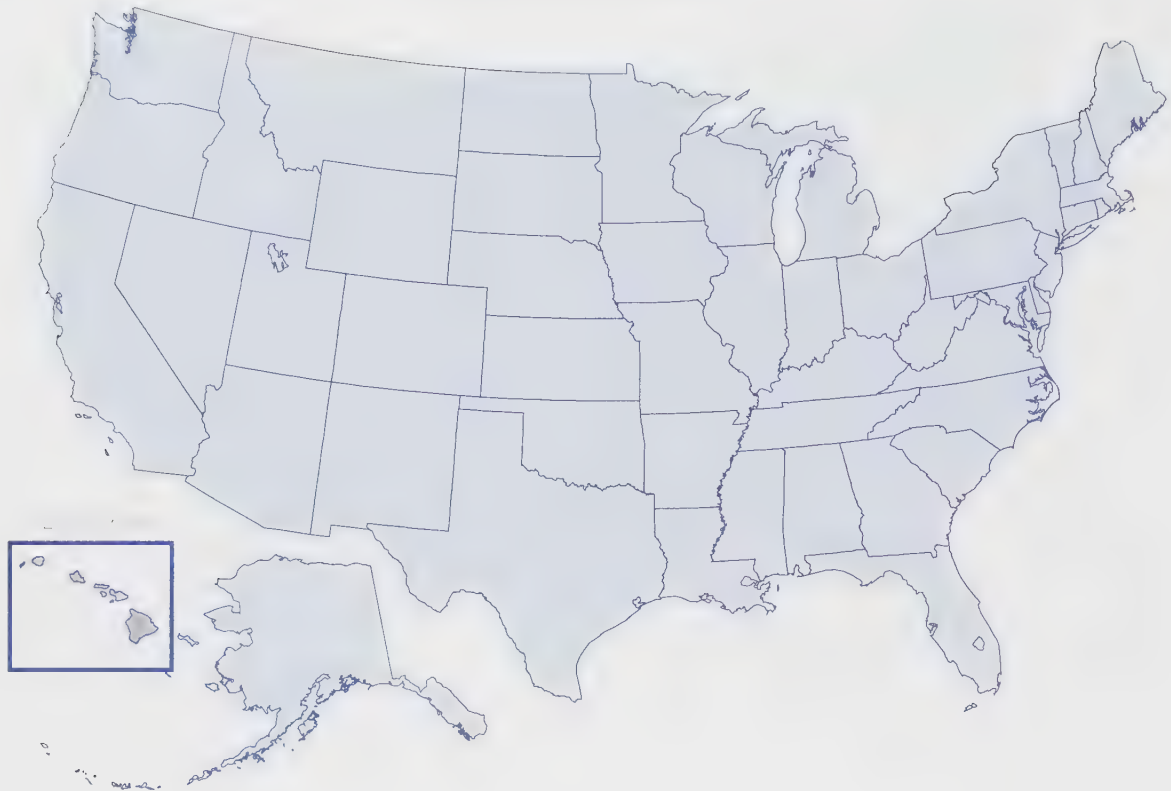

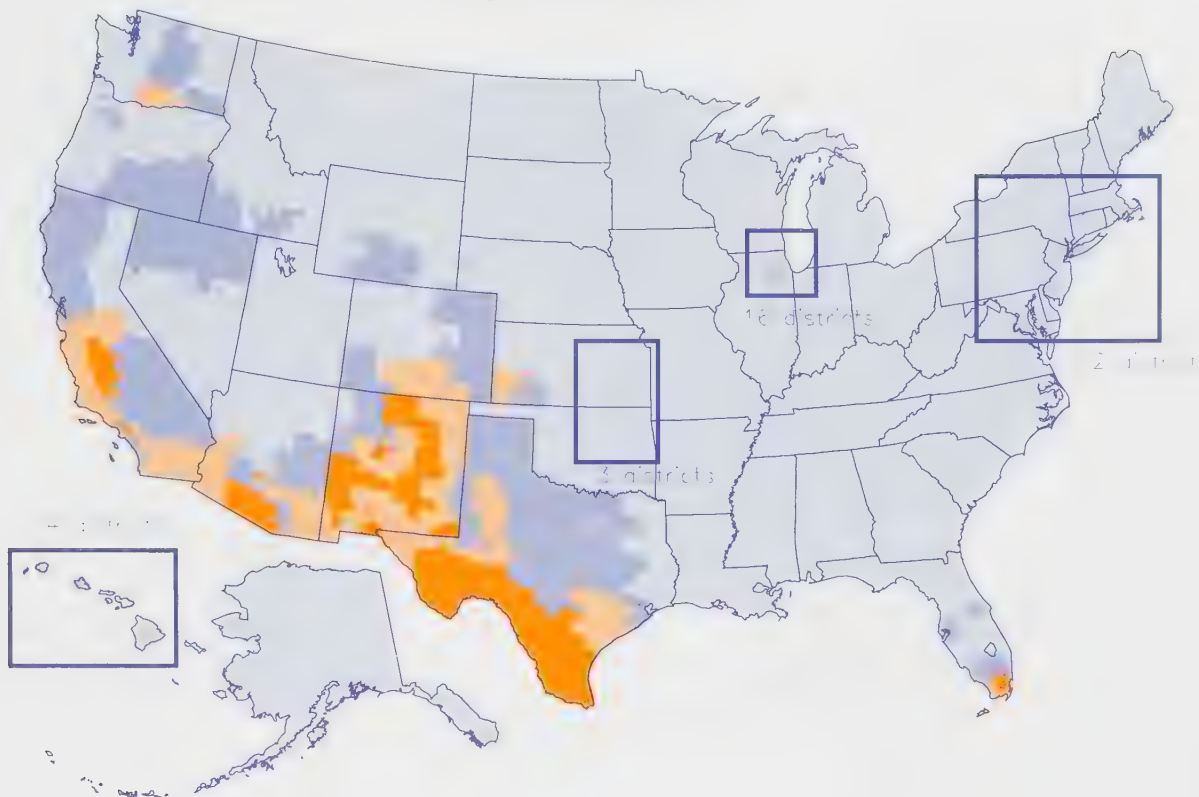

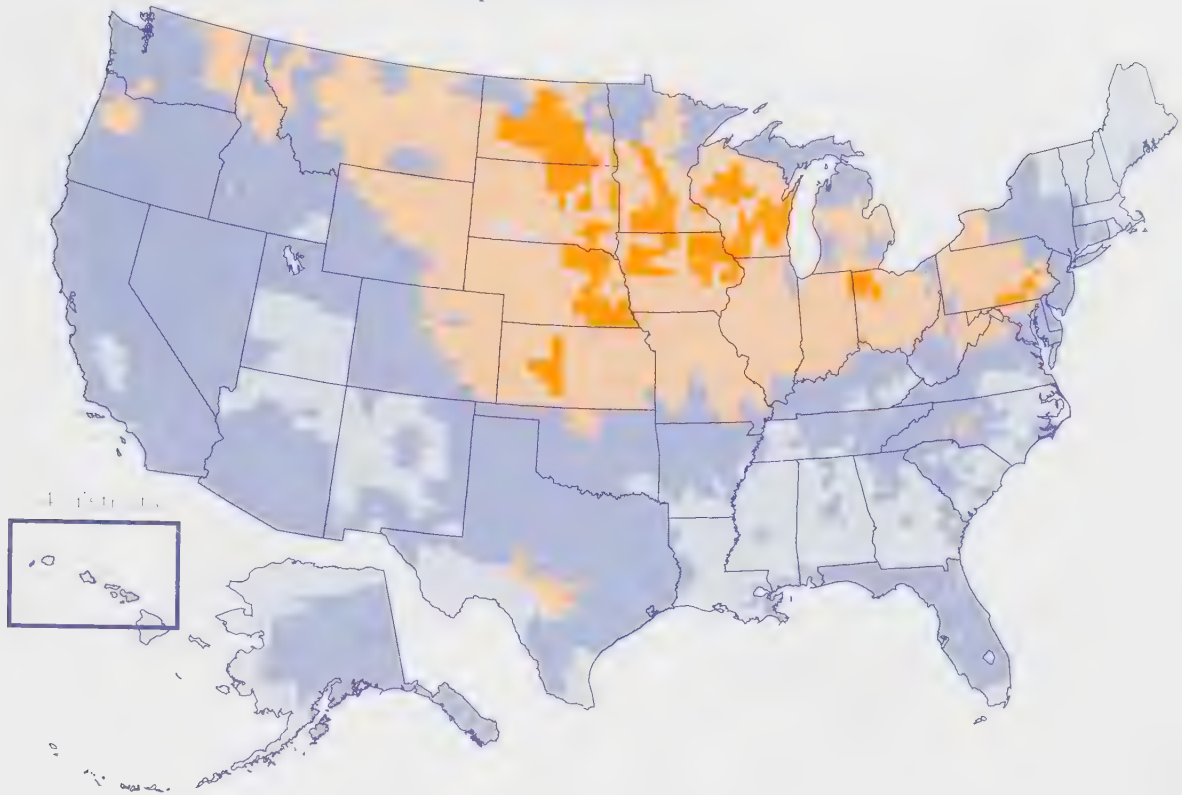

Top State Senate Districts

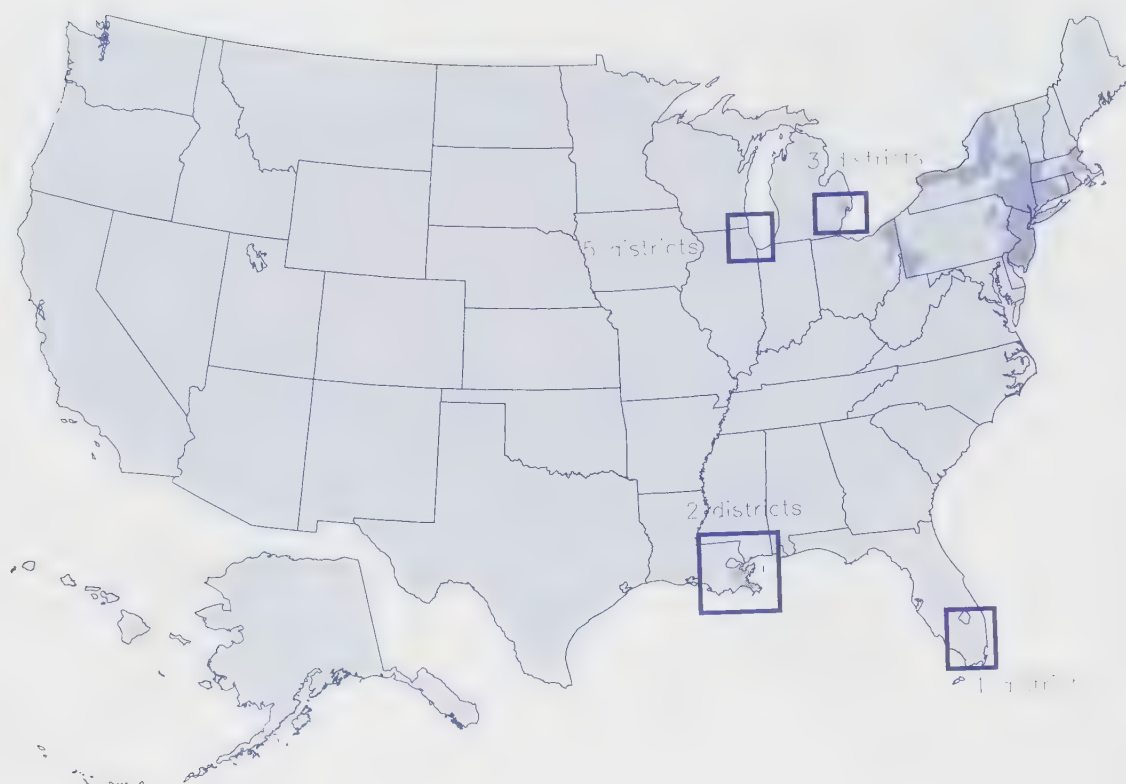

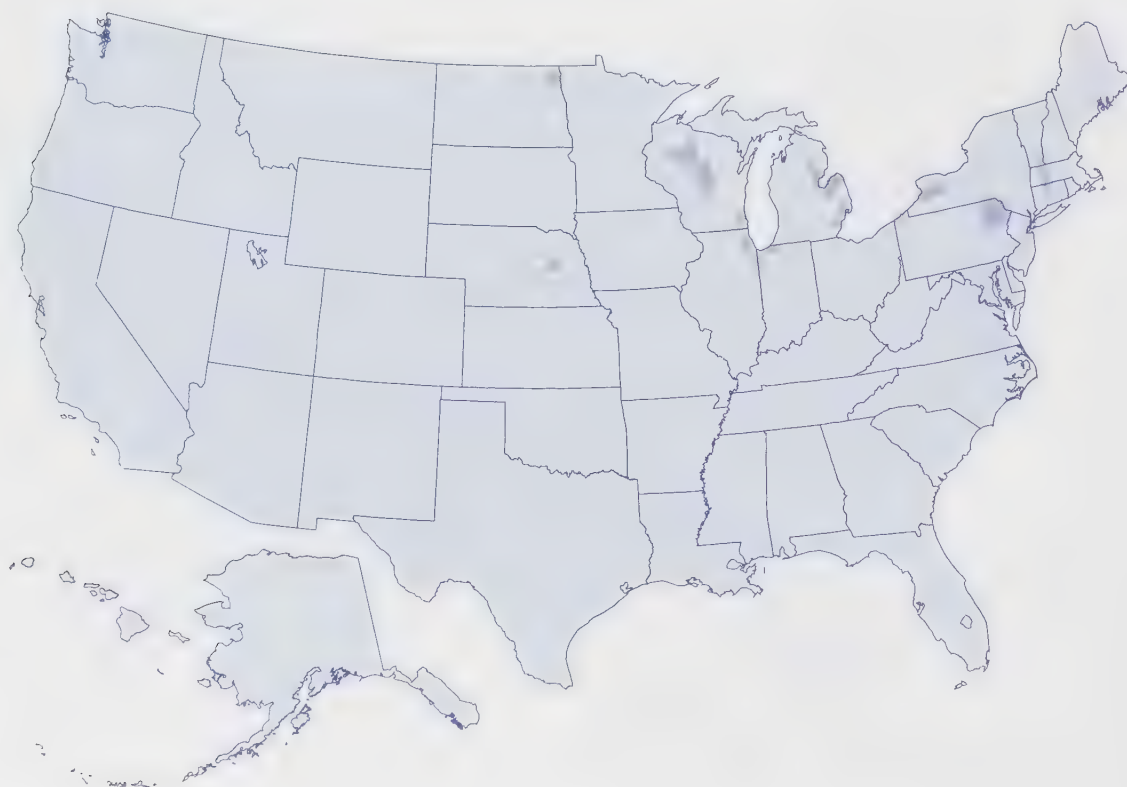

PART II SOCIO-ECONOMICS AND POLITICAL DISPERSION IN STATE LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

As we said in the introduction, the primary value of the atlas is to show how fifteen of the nation's major racial, ethnic, and ancestral groups are distributed across state legislative districts. We believe that these measurements can provide some indication of putative political power for each of the fifteen groups at the state level.

We also stated that one of the concepts underpinning the atlas was the accelerating shift in government responsibilities away from the federal government toward the states, especially in policy areas that deal with the problems of low income, poor education, and government dependence. We believe these problems also involve race and ethnicity. The atlas therefore has an important secondary value: it enables the reader to link income, education, and government dependence *both* to race, ethnicity, and ancestry *and* to state legislative districts. The reader can track for a particular group in a particular state body by finding where that group fits in national and state rankings, by individual legislative district, for household income, percentage with college education, and percentage on social security.

Table II-1 telescopes the 6,744 geo-political and socio-economic linkages into a "Top 10" analysis. Put simply, we identified the ten house and the ten senate districts with the greatest concentrations of each of the fifteen groups, averaged their household income, and ranked them according to this average. The table lists the following for the house districts for each of the fifteen groups: average household income, average percentage with a college education, and average percent on social security for the house districts. For the senate districts, the table lists the average household income.

The "Top 10" list and the related Japanese-American table (p. 113) shows that the house districts with the greatest concentrations of Japanese-Americans have the highest average household income (\$54,881), and the house districts with the greatest concentrations of Chinese-Americans have the second highest average household incomes (\$53,991). The house districts with the greatest concentrations of African-Americans have the fourth-lowest average household incomes (\$25,536), and the house districts with the greatest concentrations of Puerto-Rican-Americans have the lowest average household incomes (\$23,625). We think that some of the information in the tables may challenge readers' preconceived notions about the different groups and their income levels.

We ran the same group rankings for the "Top 15" and the "Top 20." The linkages between group and income remained roughly the same for the Top 15 and the Top 20

as for the Top 10. Any movement by any individual group was on the margins and was no greater than the insignificant differences which the Top 10 table shows for state house versus state senate. The same eight groups above the median income in the Top 10 stayed there for the Top 15 and the Top 20, just as the same seven groups below the median income in the Top 10 stayed there for the Top 15 and the Top 20. The same correlation between group income and group education levels also remained constant in the Top 10, Top 15, and Top 20. We stopped running group income linkages at the Top 20 level because below that point some group population numbers as a percentage of total population were too small to make meaningful socio-economic observations about the specific group.

We think the most important general phenomena to note in juxtaposing these "Top Ten" linkages of group and income with the numerous dispersion maps and tables that follow are that the poorer the group, the greater its geo-political concentration; and the wealthier the group, the greater its geo-political dispersal. For a graphic summary of this correlation spanning all fifteen groups, see the *InContext Geo-Political Concentration Index* on page 23. These correlations also held for the Top 15 and the Top 20.

One of the values of this atlas is that it provides, at the state legislative level, the

statistical framework linking income levels for each of the fifteen groups to the point on a continuum measuring propensity to concentrate versus propensity to disperse. The atlas attempts to answer for the 6,744 state legislative districts two interwoven questions: Are poorer groups typically more concentrated and if so by how much? Are richer groups typically more dispersed and if so by how much? The answer to the first part of both questions is an almost unqualified yes.

Only two groups deviate from the pattern linking wealth with the propensity to disperse. One was something of a surprise to us, the other was not. The surprise group is the Poles. The Poles rank relatively low on the household income scale, ninth of fifteen, and below the group median income level (\$37,370 versus \$41,873), but the Poles rank very high on the dispersion scale, fourth of fifteen. We acknowledge that the Poles' income ranking is a close call statistically, as their household income averages are in most cases only marginally below the U.S. average. In one measurement, the Top 10 state senate rankings, the Poles' average household income is above the U.S. household average; in all other cases for the Top 10, the Top 15 and the Top 20, the Poles'

average household income is slightly below the U.S. average. We are aware that the Poles' relatively low-in-income ranking could be due to their late arrival in the United States compared to other European-based immigrant groups, but that explanation is undercut by the Poles' higher propensity to disperse, a characteristic which is so typically linked with relatively high group income levels.

The group that was not a surprise is the Cubans. The Cubans have a group income level slightly higher than the median income level, ranking eighth of fifteen, but the Cubans rank low on the dispersion scale, twelfth of fifteen. There is no historical surprise here. The Cubans are well-known in American social history for their group ability to prosper; it is also well-known that Cubans are geographically concentrated in southern Florida.

The *InContext Geo-Political Concentration Index* shows the linkage of group wealth and group propensity to concentrate according to the geo-political matrix of state house legislative districts. We found that the group-to-income-to-concentration correlations remained almost unchanged for the Top 20 state house districts versus the Top 20 state senate districts, just as they did for the Top 10 house versus senate rankings. In addition, the status of the seven group winners, the six group losers, and the same two anomalous groups stayed the same whether ranked by house or senate, or by Top 10, Top 15, or Top 20. Measurements of group-to-income-to-concentration correlations based on other population matrices—such as counties, cities, standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSAs), or states—might yield different results.

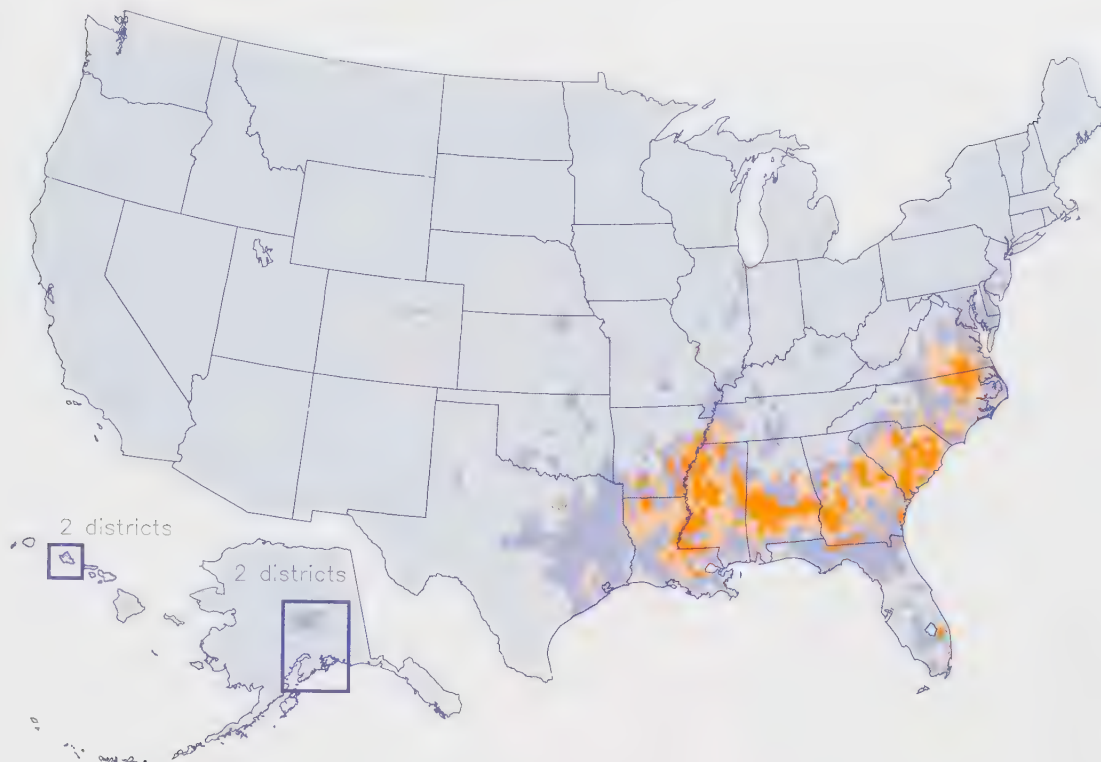

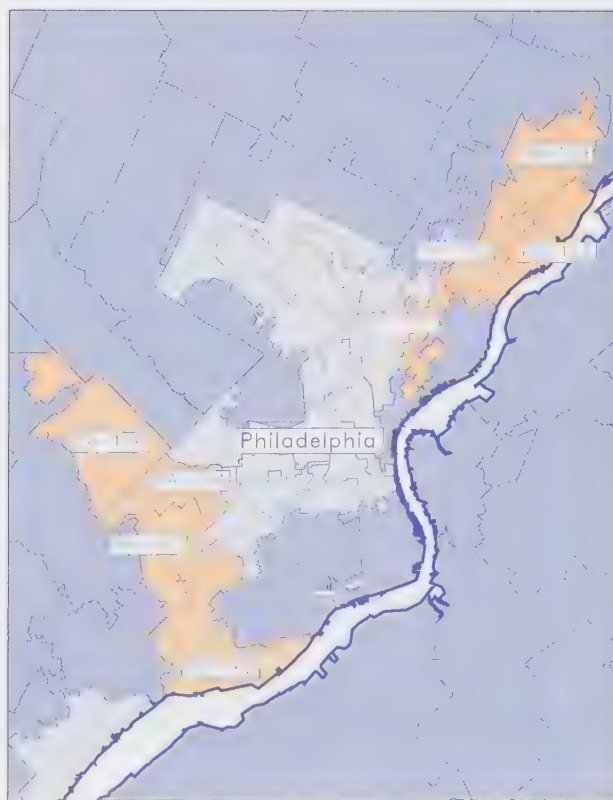
IRISH Top State House Districts

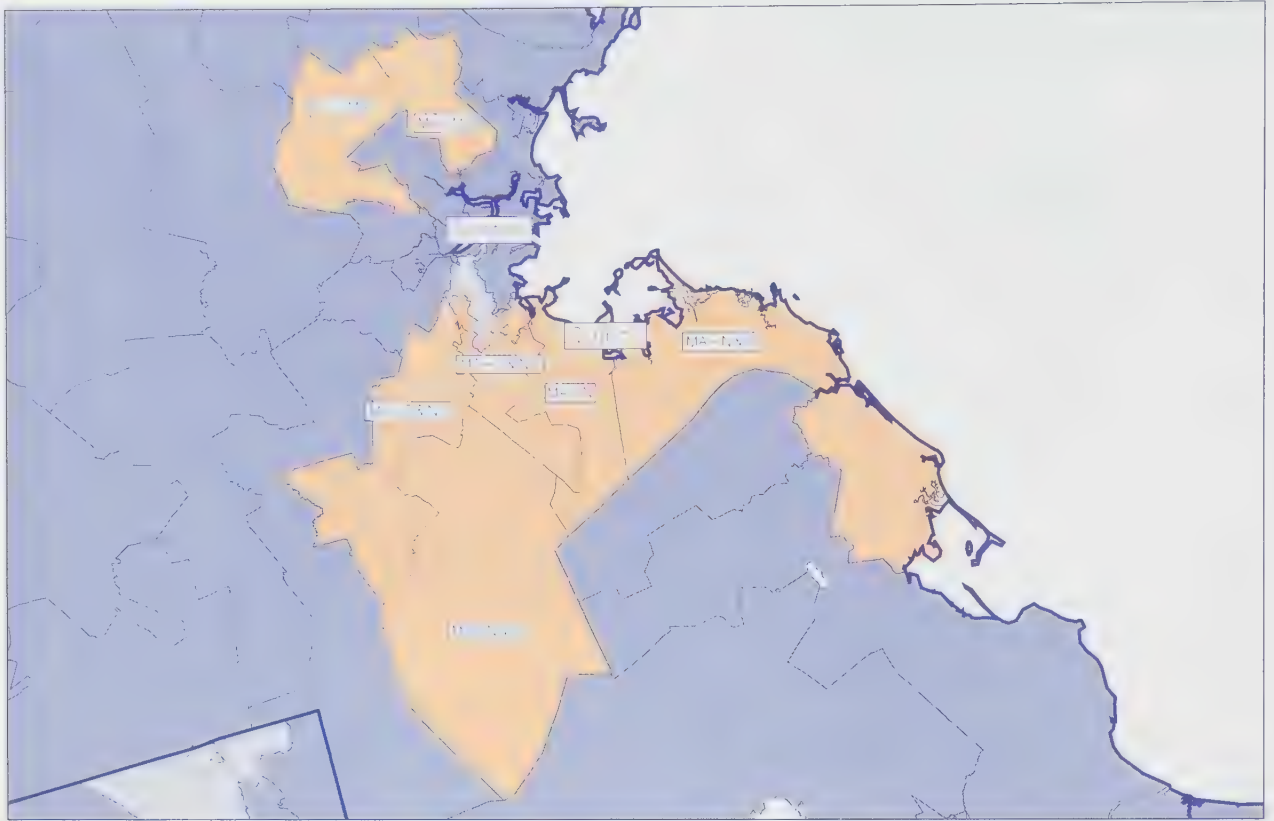

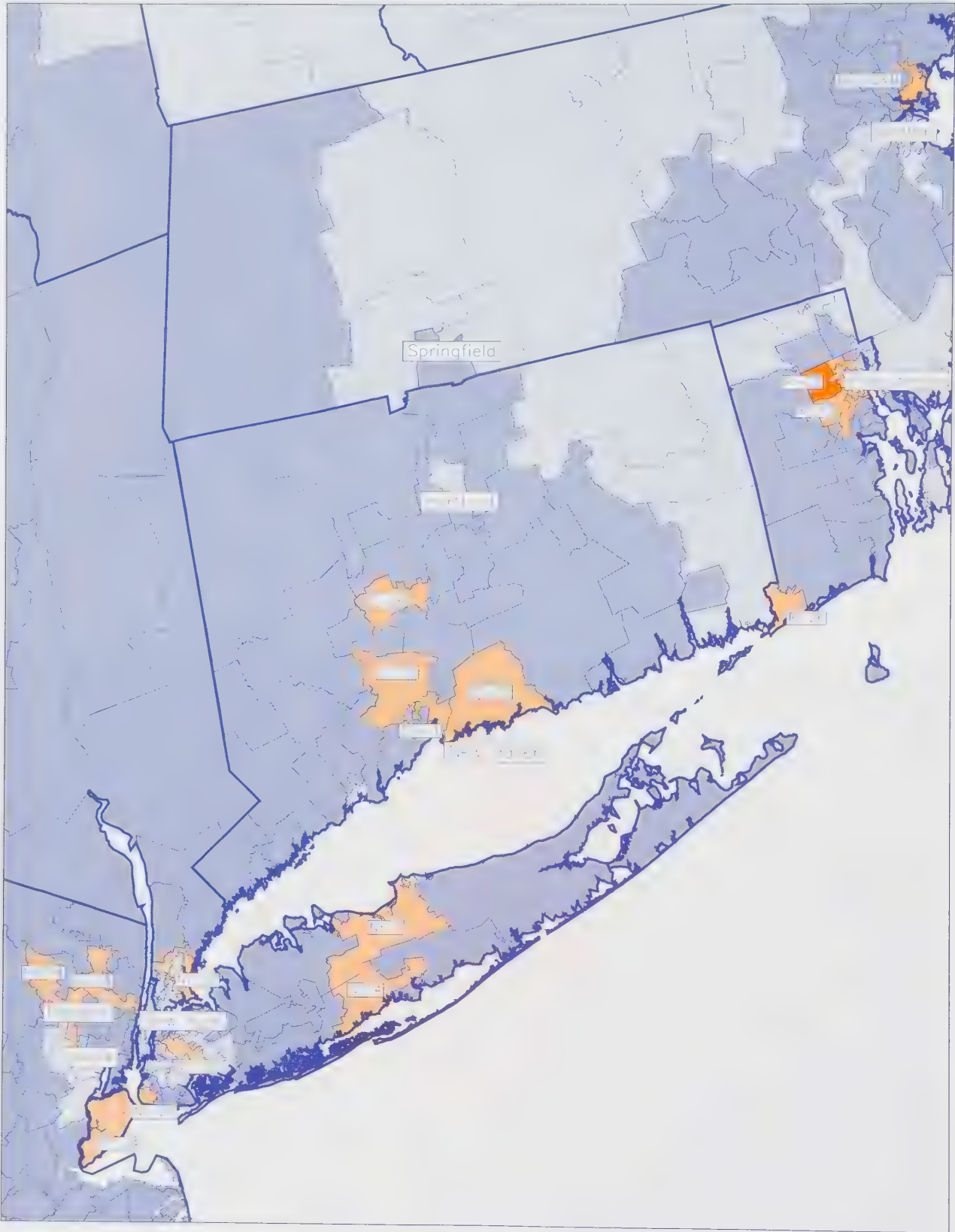
